



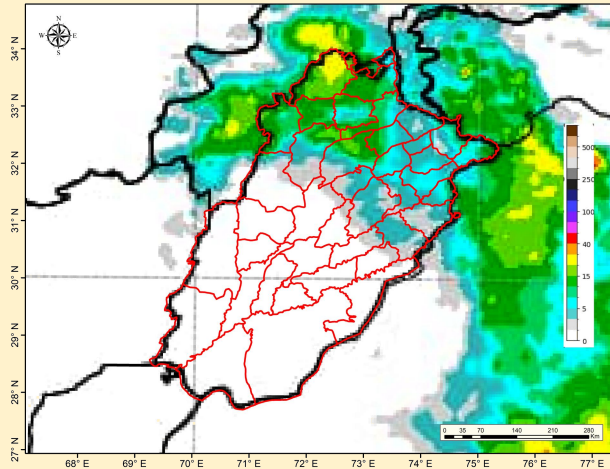

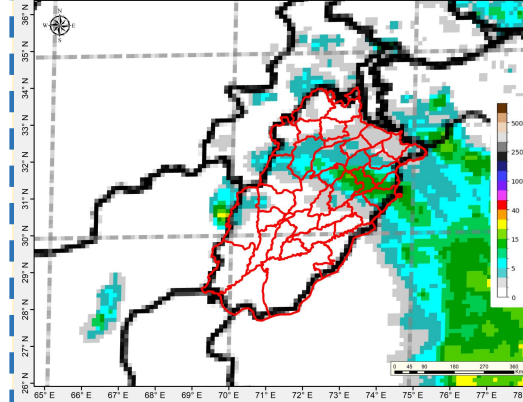

- Hot and humid weather is expected in most districts of the province.
- However, rain-wind/thundershower is likely at isolated places in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galiyat, Gujrat, Jhelum, Attock, Chakwal, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Pakpattan, Kasur, Okara, Sheikhupura, Faisalabad, Mianwali and Sargodha.
- Heavy rainfall is also expected at isolated places during the period.
- Rain-wind/thundershower may occur in Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, Sahiwal, Layyah, Bhakkar, D.G. Khan and surroundings during the evening/night.

WEATHER ADVISORY - MONSOON

MORE RAIN-THUNDERSHOWERS PREDICTED IN THE UPPER AND CENTRAL PART FROM 13TH TO 15TH AUGUST

Met office has informed that at monsoon currents are penetrating upper parts of the country. A westerly wave is also affecting upper parts of the country. Under the influence of this weather system

- Rain-wind/thundershowers (with few heavyfalls) is expected in Northeast Punjab (Murree, Sialkot, Narowal, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Lahore, Kasur, Sheikhupura, Nankana Sahib) from 12th (night) to 15th August with occasional gaps.
- Rain-wind/thundershowers (with few heavyfalls) is expected in Rawalpindi and Pothohar region from 13th (evening/night) to 15th August with occasional gaps.
- Rain-wind/thundershowers is also expected in Sargodha, Faisalabad, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Khushab, Layyah, Bhakkar, Noorpurthal, Sahiwal, Pakpattan, Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, D.G.Khan from 12th (night) to 15th August.

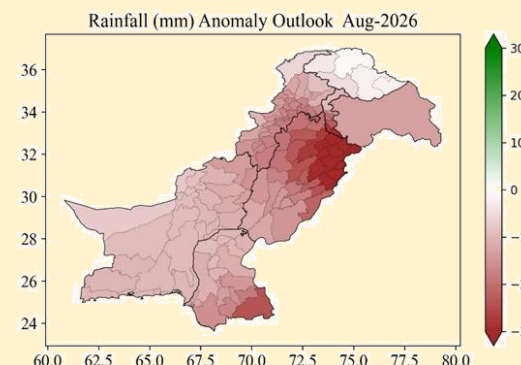
IMPACTS & PREVENTIVE MEASURES

- Heavy rains may cause Urban flooding in low lying areas of Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Sialkot and Lahore during the forecast period.
- Landslides may occur in vulnerable areas of Murree and Galliyat during the forecast period. Tourists and travelers are advised to remain cautious during the forecast period.
- Farmers are advised to manage their crop activities keeping in view the weather conditions and take care of their livestock as well.

MONTHLY RAINFALL OUTLOOK - AUGUST

According to Met Department;

- Below-normal rainfall is expected over most parts of the country during August 2026. The strongest negative rainfall anomalies are projected over northeastern and central Punjab.
- Mean temperatures are expected to remain above normal nationwide, with maximum departure over central to northeastern Punjab.



POSSIBLE IMPACTS

- Below-normal rainfall is likely to reduce water availability, increasing reliance on stored water and groundwater for agriculture.
 - The reduced rainfall may fail to fulfill irrigation needs for seasonal vegetables and growing Kharif crops, particularly in Punjab, requiring supplemental irrigation.
 - Despite below-normal rainfall, isolated heavy downpours may still trigger flash flooding in mountainous areas of Punjab, urban flooding in big metropolitan areas and hill torrents in southern Punjab.
 - Prolonged intermittent gaps between the rainfall spells could significantly increase the potential for heat stress, especially over the plain areas of Punjab.
 - Despite below-normal rainfall, isolated heavy downpours may still trigger flash flooding in mountainous areas of Punjab, urban flooding in big metropolitan areas and hill torrents in southern Punjab.
 - Spatial temperature gradient may cause strong winds, dust storms, and thunderstorm and hailstorms which may affect seasonal crops, vegetables, and orchards; farmers are advised to take precautionary measures to protect standing crops.
- **Advisory for general public:**
- Farmers are advised to visit PDMA & PMD advisories on website before irrigation or harvesting.
 - Travelers and tourists are advised to remain cautious while travelling during rainfall events.
