



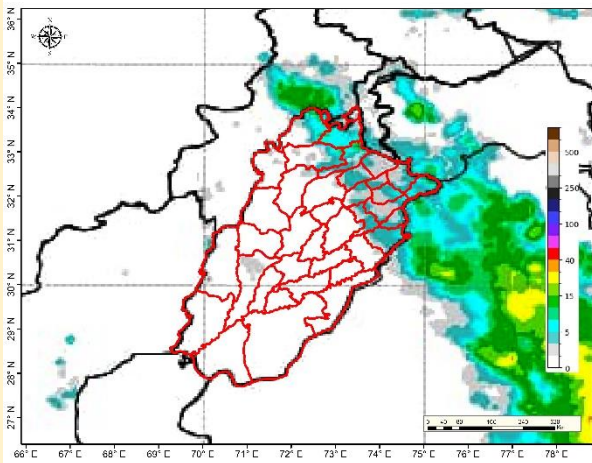

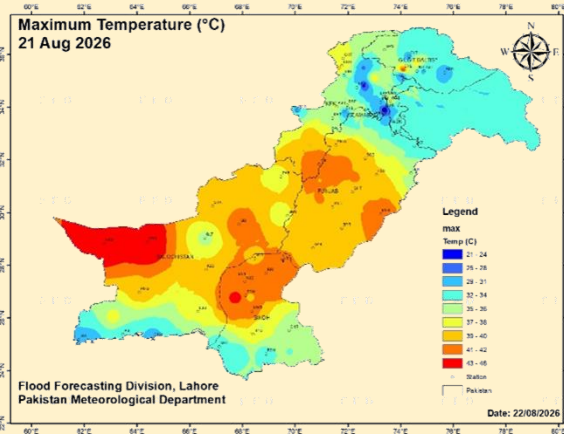


LAST 24 HOURS WEATHER SITUATION

Maximum Temperatures recorded in last 24 hours

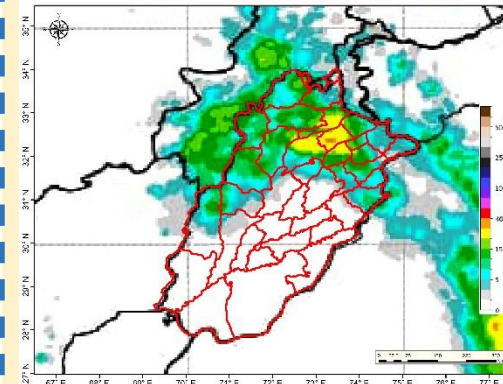

As per 0600 Hrs FFD Report:

- River Indus **at Tarbela, Chashma & Taunsa**, is at **LOW FLOOD LEVEL** while **at Kalabagh**, is at **MEDIUM FLOOD LEVEL**
- Other Rivers are flowing within normal Flow.

WEATHER ADVISORY - MONSOON

MORE RAIN-WIND/THUNDERSHOWER PREDICTED IN THE UPPER AND CENTRAL PARTS DURING THE WEEKEND

Met office (vide Letter No. NWFC-5(10A)/2026/09) informed that monsoon currents are continuously penetrating upper and central parts of the country. A westerly wave is also present over upper parts of the country. Under the influence of this weather system:

- Rain-wind/thundershower (with isolated heavyfalls) is expected in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Jhelum, Chakwal, Talagang, Attock, Sialkot, Narowal, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Lahore, Kasur, Okara, Sheikhupura, Nankana Sahib from 21st (evening/night) to 23rd August (morning) with occasional gaps, while in Sargodha, Khushab, Mianwali, Noorpur, Faisalabad, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Layyah, Bhakkar, Sahiwal, Pakpattan, D.G. Khan on 22nd August.

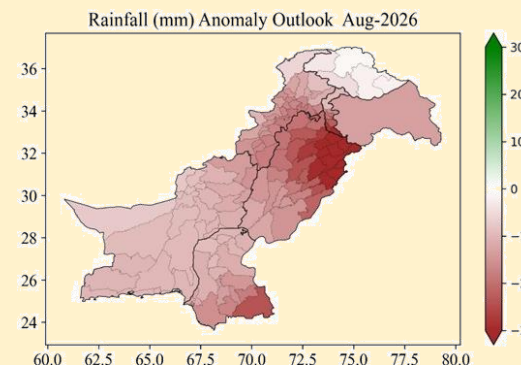
IMPACTS & PREVENTIVE MEASURES

- Heavy rains may cause Urban flooding in low lying areas of Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Sialkot and Lahore during the weekend.
- Heavy rain may cause flash flooding in local streams/ Nullah in Kashmir, Murree, Galliyat & Rawalpindi during the forecast period.
- Landslides may occur in hilly areas of Murree and Galliyat during the forecast period
- Tourists and travelers are advised to remain cautious during the forecast period.
- Farmers are advised to manage their crop activities keeping in view the weather conditions and take care of their livestock as well.

MONTHLY RAINFALL OUTLOOK - AUGUST

According to Met Department;

- Below-normal rainfall is expected over most parts of the country during August 2026. The strongest negative rainfall anomalies are projected over northeastern and central Punjab.
- Mean temperatures are expected to remain above normal nationwide, with maximum departure over central to northeastern Punjab.



POSSIBLE IMPACTS

- Below-normal rainfall is likely to reduce water availability, increasing reliance on stored water and groundwater for agriculture.
 - The reduced rainfall may fail to fulfill irrigation needs for seasonal vegetables and growing Kharif crops, particularly in Punjab, requiring supplemental irrigation.
 - Despite below-normal rainfall, isolated heavy downpours may still trigger flash flooding in mountainous areas of Punjab, urban flooding in big metropolitan areas and hill torrents in southern Punjab.
 - Prolonged intermittent gaps between the rainfall spells could significantly increase the potential for heat stress, especially over the plain areas of Punjab.
 - Despite below-normal rainfall, isolated heavy downpours may still trigger flash flooding in mountainous areas of Punjab, urban flooding in big metropolitan areas and hill torrents in southern Punjab.
 - Spatial temperature gradient may cause strong winds, dust storms, and thunderstorm and hailstorms which may affect seasonal crops, vegetables, and orchards; farmers are advised to take precautionary measures to protect standing crops.

 - Travelers and tourists are advised to remain cautious while travelling during rainfall events.
