



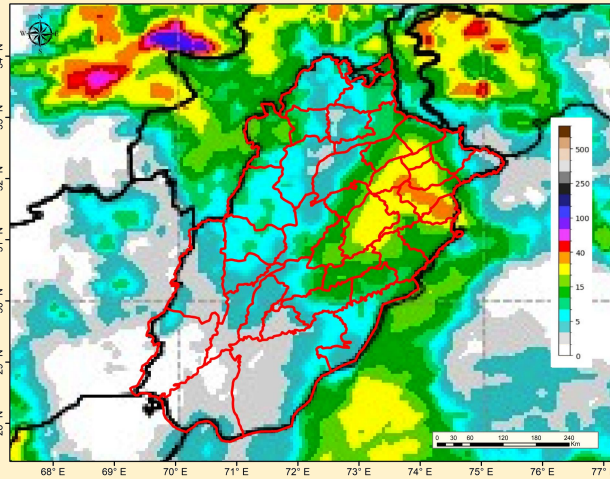

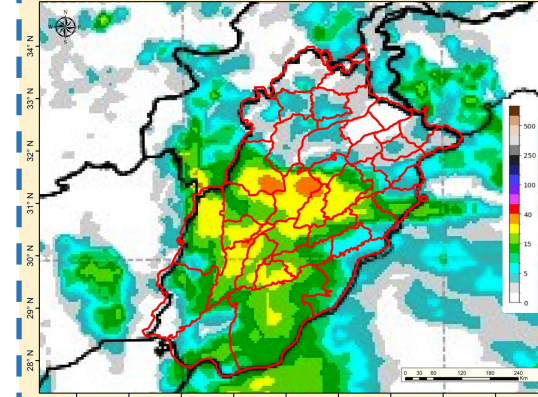

#### WEATHER FORECAST (24 HOURS)

##### Saturday

- Rain-wind/thundershowers is expected in Lahore, Gujranwala, Sheikhupura, Okara, Pakpattan, Kasur, Sialkot, Narowal, Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, Sahiwal, Rajanpur, Multan, Khanewal, Vehari, Dera Ghazi Khan, Lodhran, Muzaffargarh, Kot Addu, Rahim Yar Khan and surrounding areas.
- Isolated heavy falls is also expected during the period.
- Rain-wind/thundershowers are likely at isolated places in Murree, Galliat, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Faisalabad, Khushab, Noorpur Thal, Bhakkar, Mianwali and Sargodha during the evening/night.

- River Indus at Kalabagh, Chashma & Taunsa, is at **low flood Level**.
- River Chenab at Khanki & Qadirabad, is at **Medium flood level** while at Marala & Trimmu at **Low flood Level**.
- River Ravi at Balloki and Sidhnai, is at **Low flood Level**.
- Other Rivers are flowing within normal Flow.

## WEATHER ADVISORY - MONSOON

### MORE RAIN THUNDERSHOWERS PREDICTED IN SOUTHERN/CENTRAL PARTS FROM FRIDAY EVENING/NIGHT TO MONDAY

Met office has informed that due to the LPA (Low-Pressure Area) monsoon currents are penetrating in Southern and central parts of the country. Under the influence of this weather system

- Rain windstorm/thundershower (with isolated heavy falls) is expected in Lahore, Sheikhupura Okara, Sahiwal, Pak Pattan, Vehari, Khanewal, Multan, Dera Gazi Khan, Rajanpur, Kot Addu, Muzaffargarh, Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar, R Y Khan and Khan Pur from 24th (evening/night) to 27th July.
- Mostly partly cloudy at times cloudy weather conditions with rain-thundershower is expected in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Faisalabad, Khushab, Sargodha, Sialkot, Narowal, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Nankana Sahib and Chiniot from 24th (evening/night) to 26th July with occasional gaps.

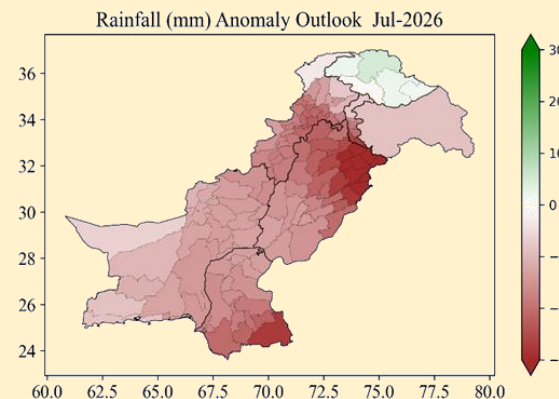
### IMPACTS & PREVENTIVE MEASURES

- Windstorm & lightning may damage weak structures (solar panels, electric poles, bill boards etc.) during the forecast period.
- Heavy rains may cause Urban flooding in Gujranwala, Lahore, on 24th/25th July While in Bahawalpur, RY Khan, Sialkot, Multan and Faisalabad from 24th to 26th July.
- Tourists and travelers are advised to remain extra cautious and avoid unnecessary travelling during the forecast period.
- Farmers are advised to manage their crop activities keeping in view the weather conditions and take care of their livestock as well.
- Prevailing hot and humid conditions are likely to subside during the forecast period.

## MONTHLY RAINFALL OUTLOOK - JULY

### According to Met Department;

- Below-normal rainfall is largely anticipated across the country during July 2026, with the most pronounced negative anomalies expected over northeastern Punjab.
- Mean temperatures are expected to remain above normal\* nationwide, with maximum departure over eastern Gilgit-Baltistan, and central to northeastern Punjab in July 2026.
- The likelihood of warmer-than-normal conditions is particularly high over most of Punjab.



### POSSIBLE IMPACTS

- Below-normal rainfall is likely to reduce water availability, increasing reliance on stored water and groundwater for agriculture.
  - The reduced rainfall may fail to fulfill irrigation needs for seasonal vegetables and growing Kharif crops, particularly in Punjab, requiring supplemental irrigation.
  - Prolonged intermittent gaps between the rainfall spells could significantly increase the potential for heat stress, especially over the plain areas of Punjab.
  - Despite below-normal rainfall, isolated heavy downpours may still trigger flash flooding in mountainous areas of Punjab, urban flooding in big metropolitan areas and hill torrents in southern Punjab.
  - Spatial temperature gradient may cause strong winds, dust storms, and thunderstorm and hailstorms which may affect seasonal crops, vegetables, and orchards; farmers are advised to take precautionary measures to protect standing crops.
- **Advisory for general public:**
- The public is advised to avoid prolonged outdoor exposure, particularly between 11:00 AM and 4:00 PM.
  - Stay well hydrated, wear light and loose-fitting clothing, and seek shade or cool indoor environments whenever possible.
  - Elderly people, children, and outdoor workers should take extra precautions to minimize the risk of heat-related illnesses.
