



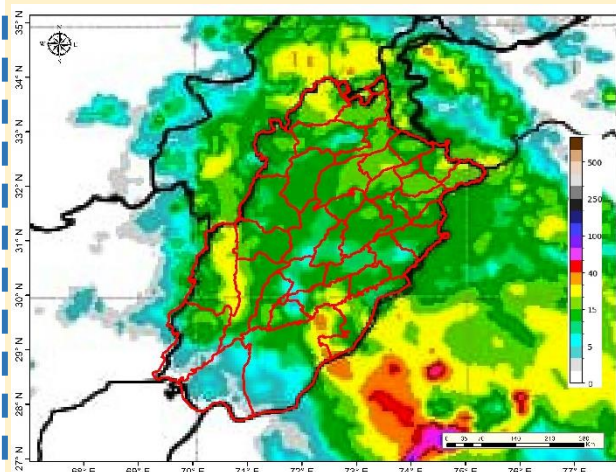

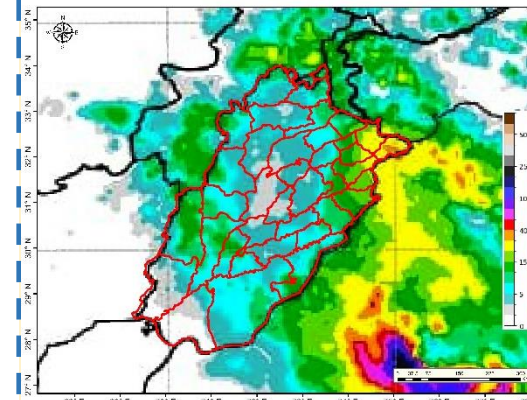

- However, rain-wind/thundershower is likely in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahaiddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Nankana Sahib, Okara, Kasur and Sheikhupura.
- Isolated heavy falls may also occur during the period.
- Rain-wind/thundershower may occur in Faisalabad, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Chiniot, Khushab, Mianwali, Sargodha, Sahiwal, Layyah, Bhakkar and Noorpur Thal during evening/night.

WEATHER ADVISORY - MONSOON

MORE MONSOON RAINS PREDICTED IN THE COUNTRY FROM 29TH JULY TO 5TH AUGUST

Met office has informed that monsoon currents from Arabian Sea & Bay of Bengal are likely to penetrate upper and central parts of the country from 29th July. A westerly wave is currently affecting northern areas, which is likely to strengthen and affect most upper and central parts from 1st August. Under the influence of this weather system?

- **Rain-wind/thundershowers (with scattered heavy falls at times very heavy)** is expected in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Okara, Kasur, Sheikhupura, Nankana Sahib, Faisalabad, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Chiniot, Khushab, Mianwali, Layyah, Bhakkar, Noorpurthal, Sargodha, Sahiwal and Pakpattan from 29th July to 4th August with occasional gaps..
- **Rain-wind/thundershowers (with scattered heavy falls)** is expected in Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar, Rahim Yar Khan, Khanpur, Multan, Vehari, Khanewal, Lodhran, Muzaffargarh, Kot Addu, Dera Ghazi Khan and Rajanpur from 31st July to 3rd August with occasional gaps.

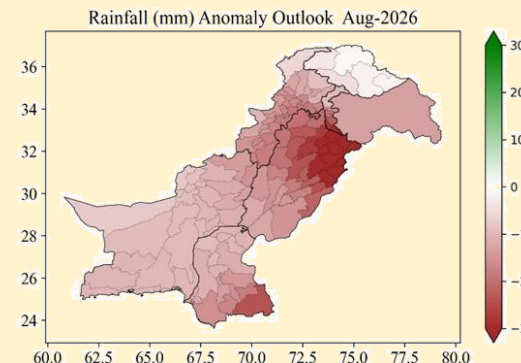
IMPACTS & PREVENTIVE MEASURES

- Heavy rains may cause **Urban flooding** in low lying areas of Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Sialkot, Lahore, Multan and Faisalabad from 30th July to 4th August.
- **Landslides** may occur in vulnerable areas of Murree, Galliat from 30th July to 5th August.
- Heavy rains may generate **flash floods** in local streams/Nullahs of Kashmir, Murree, Galliat, Northeastern Punjab, hill torrents of DG Khan during the forecast period.
- Heavy rains, **Windstorm & lightning** may **damage weak structures** (solar panels, electric poles, bill boards etc.) during the forecast period.
- **Tourists and travelers** are advised to **remain cautious** during the forecast period.
- Farmers are advised to **manage their crop activities** keeping in view the weather conditions and take care of their livestock as well.

MONTHLY RAINFALL OUTLOOK - AUGUST

According to Met Department;

- Below-normal rainfall is expected over most parts of the country during August 2026. The strongest negative rainfall anomalies are projected over northeastern and central Punjab.
- Mean temperatures are expected to remain above normal nationwide, with maximum departure over central to northeastern Punjab.



POSSIBLE IMPACTS

- Below-normal rainfall is likely to **reduce water availability**, increasing reliance on stored water and groundwater for agriculture.
 - The reduced rainfall **may fail to fulfill irrigation needs** for seasonal vegetables and growing Kharif crops, particularly in Punjab, requiring supplemental irrigation.
 - Despite **below-normal rainfall**, **isolated heavy downpours** may still trigger **flash flooding** in mountainous areas of Punjab, urban flooding in big metropolitan areas and hill torrents in southern Punjab.
 - Prolonged intermittent gaps between the rainfall spells could significantly **increase the potential for heat stress**, especially over the plain areas of Punjab.
 - Despite below-normal rainfall, **isolated heavy downpours may still trigger flash flooding** in mountainous areas of Punjab, urban flooding in big metropolitan areas and hill torrents in southern Punjab.
 - **Spatial temperature gradient** may cause strong winds, dust storms, and thunderstorm and hailstorms which may affect seasonal crops, vegetables, and orchards; farmers are advised to take **precautionary measures to protect standing crops**.
