

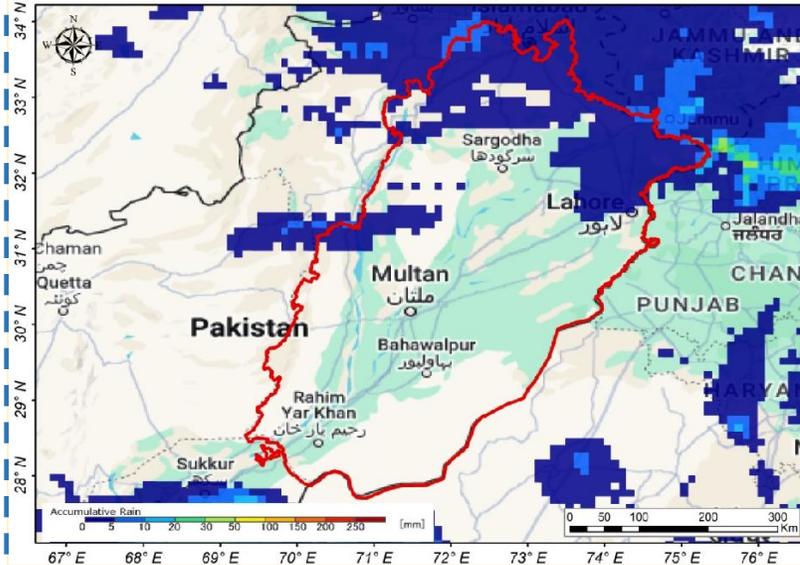



**Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours (Saturday)**

Isolated thunder storms/rain of light to moderate intensity are expected over the upper catchments of all the Major rivers along with Gujranwala, Lahore & Multan Divisions. Scattered thunder storms/Rains of moderate intensity are expected over Rawalpindi, Sargodha and DG Khan divisions.

**RAINFALL OUTLOOK**

Moderate rainfall activity with isolated heavy falls is likely to start over the upper catchments of all the major rivers from 22nd July

**Meteorological Features (influencing the weather in next 24 Hours)**

The trough of a westerly wave has moved from northeastern Afghanistan and Pakistan to Kashmir and nearby areas. A well-marked monsoon low has developed over the northwest Bay of Bengal. Light to moderate moisture from the Bay of Bengal is entering the upper parts of the country, while moisture from the Arabian Sea is converging over South Sindh and adjacent India up to 5,000 feet. The monsoon trough is situated south of the Himalayan foothills.

### HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION AT 0000 PST


The water flow at Tarbela is at low flood level, while all other major rivers are flowing at normal levels.

### GUIDLINES TO DDMA'S

- Activate control rooms on 24/7 mode, well managed & equipped
- Municipalities / WASAs of Low-lying areas need to be vigilant and keep de-watering and pumping stations ready
- Arrange alternate source of power to keep pumping station operational in case of electricity failure
- Municipalities / WASAs to remove any obstacle in the flow of sewer
- DDMA's to issue early warning to the residents of Low-lying areas
- Issue advisories to the farming community to avoid irrigating cotton crops where rainfall is forecasted.
