
KHANEWAL DISTRICT

1) **BACKDROP**

This flood plan provides a well coordinated and effective mechanism to tackle the nature calamity of flood caused by revir water and heavy rains during the rainy season. District Administration intends to provide relief through community involvement at the grassroots level. It has set up a tier of teams, starting from a village to be taken as a unit, who will works towards achieving objectives laid down for them.

OBJECTIVES

District Khanewal Flood Plan has the following objectives:

- An effort to mitigate circumstances of flood affecting the District through detailed surveys and repair of flood embankments. Also community mobilization to convince people to move out of the river bed.
- Preparation beforehand by making of teams and allocating duties so that they come into operation immediately in order to rescue both persons and livestock.
- Provision of relief through operationalization of relief camps.
- Focus on rescue and relief will be primary objectives but this by no means lessens the importance of rehabilitation for which damaged assessment shall be carried out at a later stage.

2) **KHANEWAL: FLOOD VULNERABILITY ASSESMENT**

Khanewal District was created in the year 1985. The Peshawar – Karachi main Railway line and the National Highway pass through the District. It is surrounded by 06 Districts namely Multan, Jhang, Sahiwal, Vehari , Toba Tek Singh and Muaffar Garah. It comprises four Tehsils i.e. Khanewal, Mian Channu, Kabirwala and Jahanian. A major part of its Tehsils Kabirwala and Mian Channu are old settled areas along the banks of Ravi and Chenab which makes these two highly susceptible to floods.

i) Tehsil Mian Channu

- ii)** Tehsil Mian Channu is situated between two rivers, i.e. river Ravi flows on its North and the Sukh Bias passes from the South. Flood in the Ravi causes serious damage to people living on its left bank. Evacuation of people and livestock is carried out with help of private as well as army boats. The highest level of flood in the Ravi affected the left marginal Bund at R.D. 38000 near Mouza Azim Hiraj in the year 1992. Flood water in

Sukh Bias after traversing through the common boundary line of L.B.D.C and Nili Bar enters Khanewal District at Chak No. 52/15-L in Sub Division Main Channu and flows onward passing through village Rahim Shah and Chak 115/10-R of Jahanian.

ii) Tehsil Jahanian

Due to its geographical location, at present no river flows through this area. There is a remote possibility that due to heavy rains Sukh Bias may fill up beyond capacity and so inundate the surroundings areas of Tehsil Jahanian.

iii) Tehsil Kabirwala

Tehsil Kabirwala is surrounded by Tehsils i.e. Tehsil Khanewal, Mianchannu, Multan, Muzaffargarh, Shorkot and Kamalia. It is prime target of floods in both rivers Ravi and Chenab. River Ravi joins the river Chenab at Chowki Mohan, Kabirwala. After passing through Mian Channu for a distance of about 35km river Chenab enters Kabirwala. The main flood bunds namely Fazil Shah Flood Bund and Chenab Protection Bund have been raised to protect various vulnerable villages of the sub division; Fazil Shah Flood Bund is about 3 km long whereas the Chenab Protection Bund stretches to a length of 27km. These bunds are the first line of defence against flood in the Chenab. In 1973, Chenab protection Bund breached occurred opposite the village Khokhara Mohabbat Tragger between RD 82 to RD 96 and a vast area falling within the Chenab protection bund and Shujaabad Canal (second defense line) was affected by flood water. Irrigation Department had constructed a loop bund to protect adjoining localities, but flood water touched the loop bund.

iv) Flood Stages and Discharge Limits

The Punjab Flood Commissioner, in the 56th meeting held on 17-06-1974 approved a revised discharge limit for various categories of floods. These limits have been in force since then. Distance between various barrages on river Chenab & Ravi and main strategic points on flood bunds along with respective time lags is given as:

3) **STRATEGY**

Community is the focus of both vulnerability as well as rescue and relief efforts in District Khanewal. Village is an essential community unit, therefore, our flood plan revolves around village as a community and village-wise teams have been constituted for prompt warning and speedy response. These teams are, however, part of larger sector wise teams with the inbuilt capacity to respond individually as well as collectively. Villages have been grouped into sectors and separate sector wise teams have been constituted to over see and coordinate the work of village teams.

This flood plan has been designed keeping in view the following aspects of disaster management i.e.

- Mitigation
- Preparation
- Rescue
- Relief

It is a result of detailed brainstorming sessions with all stake holders in an effort to come up with a comprehensive, quick action flood plan.

i) **Flood Sectors**

District Khanewal has been divided into following sectors for the purpose of carrying out rescue and relief operations. These are as:

ii) **Sector wise Flood Committee**

To effectively manage and organize any relief activity, smaller administrative units are ideal with teams who would manage these units.

Therefore, the sector wise flood committee will comprise of the following members i.e.

- Tehsildar/Naib Tehsildar
- Qanungo
- Union Council Secretary
- SI &ASI

Alongwith representatives from the following departments

- Agriculture
- Education
- Livestock
- Rescue 1122
- Social Welfare

These sector teams will perform the following functions:

- They will collect and disseminate information relating to flood to Tehsil and District Control rooms
- They will coordinate with all village teams which come within their sector and will:
 - Communicate with all village teams regularly
 - Inform them precisely about location of relief camps
 - In case of flood, ensure that all village teams are able to safely bring villagers to their designated relief camps
 - Establish and operate relief camps
- They shall ensure that adequate food and non food items are available in every relief camp and equally distribution the same among the affectees.
- They shall also be responsible for inspecting embankments.
- They shall overlook the functioning of different relief committees working in that area

iii) **Village Team**

In order to come up with a comprehensive and functional plan, we have planned from the basic unit of a village. As mentioned earlier, Tehsils Mianchannu and Kabirwala are susceptible to floods. A detailed survey has been carried out by both irrigation and revenue departments whereby areas likely to be affected in case of flood have been identified. In these areas teams have been made in every village. A Village team shall comprise on the following persons:

- Patwari (Revenue)
- Lambardaar
- 1 to 2 Constables

iv) Village Team Functions:

- It will communicate regularly with sector team and inform all villagers about the likelihood of floods
- In case of evacuation, it will ensure that all villagers have safely left the village. The lambardaar would be the last person to leave the village
- It shall know beforehand the relief camp assigned to the village and guide all villagers to it.
- It will also play the role of informant and will inform the sector team if any water level rises to a dangerous level and it would be necessary that village must be evacuated.

v) Operationalization of Relief Camps

In case of floods, relief camps would be established in flood prone tehsils namely Mian Channu and Kabirwala. These relief camps would be located close to flood protection bunds and would cater to the requirements of flood affectees. The following officers will perform functions as given below:

District Police Officer	Ensure necessary security arrangements
EDO (Education)	Ensure presence of teachers and scouts for distribution of food etc.
EDO (Health)	Ensure availability of doctors, paramedical staff and medicines
District Officer (Livestock)	Provision of veterinary medicines and “Wanda”
Tehsil Municipal Officer	Ensure cleanliness, clean drinking water, fumigation
Assistant Commissioner	Ensure transport of affectees to camps, proper tentage and basic facilities
Incharge District Control Room; NGO Wing; Central Warehouse	Ensure uninterrupted supply of food and non food items

4) COMMAND AND CONTROL

Village team leaders will report to Sector Team Leaders and Sector Team Leaders will report to Tehsil Control which will function under the over all control of Assistant Commissioner. Additional Collector at the District Control Room will be responsible for the effective information flows and timely response in case there is need for provisions / supplies beyond the capacity of the Tehsil Administration.

i) District Control Room

District Flood Control Room has been established under the overall supervision of the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue)/Focal Person of the District on Telephone No. 065-9200147. The District Flood Control Room shall function as the central point for all coordination and information dissemination. It will function round the clock.

The District Control Room shall perform the following functions:

- Coordination amongst all concerned departments
- Coordination with NDMA, PDMA, Meteorological Office etc.
- Coordination with INGOs & NGOs
- Information gathering and dissemination
- Coordination with Purchase Committee, Warehouse, Entry Points.
- Coordination with Tehsil Control Rooms.

ii) Tehsil Control Room

Every Tehsil will establish a control room in the office of Assistant Commissioner which will become a medium of communication of information from village and sector to the district. Also, the Assistant Commissioner, being incharge of the Tehsil Control Room shall bring about liaison with flood volunteers and NGOs volunteering help in the Tehsil. It shall comprise of the following persons:

5) ROLE OF DEPARTMENTS

Keeping in view the intensity and impact of floods, it is necessary to reel in all departments for management of this natural disaster in an organized and effective manner. The following departments in the district will pool in resources (material and human) and services need arising;

i) Revenue Department

- It will ensure that all persons from the department who are deputed in Village Teams and Sector Teams are present and active
- It will coordinate activities for flood management, evacuation of people from affected areas and shifting them to designated relief camps
- It will remain overall incharge of all pre and post flood activities taken up in the district

ii) Police Department

- It will ensure that all persons from the department who are deputed in Village Teams and Sector Teams are present and active
- It shall look after the overall law and order situation in the District
- It shall take effective steps to quell all efforts made by the public to breach an embankment
- It shall make security arrangements in all operational relief camps
- Traffic police shall make an effective plan for regulation of traffic particularly if flood water enters the city

iii) Irrigation Department

- It is responsible for upkeep and maintenance of all flood embankments
- A pre-flood inspection of bunds shall be carried out and deficiencies addressed following which a certificate is to be issued on condition of bunds
- It shall deploy officials who shall remain permanently stationed on all bunds with emergency equipment for quick action in case of breach. It shall keep handy stocks of stone and earth to repair a breach
- All movable machinery available with the department shall be placed at a safe place near flood prone areas so that same is at hand in case of an emergency
- It shall assist the Breaching Committee in performance of its functions

iv) Health Department

- It is responsible for healthcare arrangements throughout the district in case of flood
- It shall set up camp in all operational relief camps which will have present vaccines and antivenom along with other medication to prevent any outbreaks or medical emergency.
- It shall carry out a vaccination campaign throughout flood prone areas against infectious diseases and to prevent an epidemic
- It shall ensure that all vehicles and ambulances are in working order before the start of the flood season
- Both DHQ and THQs will be on high alert in case of flood warning

v) Agriculture and Livestock

- It will ensure that all persons from the department who are deputed in Sector Teams are present and active
- It will assist in saving dry stores of grain etc livestock, dry fodder and stocks of animal feed along with dairy machinery utensils

- It will carry out curative and prophylactic vaccination of animals, control parasital diseases and treat sick and/or wounded livestock to prevent spreading of disease
- Both agriculture and livestock shall carry out a survey of damage to crops and livestock as well as animal feed to assess losses occurred in flood

vi) Food Department

- It will ensure that adequate quantities of food stocks are available in the district
- Ration depots will be established at places assigned by the District
- It will ensure protection of storage godowns against flood water and plunder

vii) RESCUE 1122

- It will ensure that all persons from the department who are deputed in Sector Teams are present and active
- Persons deputed in Sector Teams shall provide on the spot paramedical services need arising
- Its ambulances and staff shall be on high alert to address any eventuality in case of flood
- It shall also keep in reserve an ambulance and staff to address emergencies other than flood management

viii) Tehsil Municipal Administration

- All TMAs in the District shall ensure that both vehicles and machinery are in working order and stock sufficient fuel in case of flood warning
- They shall prepare an emergency action plan against an eventuality of flood water entering the cities
- A duty roster of sanitary workers to be employed at all operational relief camps shall be prepared after coordination among all four TMAs of the district
- All out effort will be made by all TMAs to keep surroundings clean, prevent choking of drains etc

ix) Civil Defence

- It shall enroll volunteers from the district who will take part in rescue and relief activities. List of volunteers shall be provided to the Additional District Collector
- It shall train volunteers on how to carry out rescue activity in flood hit areas
- Schedule of mock exercises shall be submitted in the office of Additional Collector of the District

x) Community Development

- It will ensure that all Secretaries of Union councils who are deputed in Sector Teams are present and active
- All Secretaries of Union Councils shall be supervised by EDO (CD)

- All Secretaries of Union Councils will be mobilized in rescue, relief and rehabilitation activities as and when required

6) **PROCUREMENT AND PROVISIONS**

i) **Stock Taking Committees**

A Stock Taking Committee will take stock of all requirements for the purpose of procurement of food and non-food items and medicines etc in order to make procurement of items which are actually needed on ground in sufficient quantity. It will also keep track of provisions available in warehouses. This committee would be guided by Tehsil and District Control room. A Stock Taking Committee shall comprise of the following members:

- Addl: Deputy Commissioner (Finance) Chairman
- Addl: Deputy Commissioner (General) Member
- District Officer (E&IP) Member

It will in particular, take stock of the following items:

- Dry Food Items
- NFIs
- Hygiene Kits
- Tents
- Medicines
- Veterinary Medicines & “Wanda”

ii) **District Purchase Committee**

District Purchase Committee will identify suppliers of tentage, food and NFIs in the District as well as in the neighboring districts to ensure uninterrupted supply of needed provisions. It shall make purchases after coordination with Stock taking Committee and Warehouse management at the Tehsil and District level. It shall comprise of the following members:

iii) Central Warehouse

A central warehouse will be set up in District Headquarters. It shall be managed by the Assistant Commissioner, Khanewal. A Computerized record of all stocks shall be maintained such as receipt and delivery of relief goods. Internet facilities will be available at the warehouse to make convenient communication by email between the Tehsil and district warehouses as well as with stock taking and procurement committees.

iv) Tehsil Warehouses

Each Tehsil will maintain its own warehouse which will coordinate with the central warehouse.

v) Transport Pool

A Transport Pool shall be maintained at the District level under supervision of Secretary DRTA. Vehicles out of the said pool will be handed over to Tehsils on need basis. The Assistant Commissioner of the Tehsil shall communicate demand to the Addl: Deputy Commissioner (Rev) who shall provide vehicles in accordance with the need of the hour.

The following vehicles shall be made available in the transport pool:

- Tractors
- Trolleys
- Hiace
- Pickups
- Trucks
- Boats (See Annexure-B)

vi) NGO Coordination Wing

District Khanewal plans to engage NGO's both international and local presently working in the district in case of floods. The coordination wing shall be managed by EDO (Community Development) who will perform the following functions:

- Coordinate with INGOs/ NGOs/ Donors and Philanthropists
- Keep liaison with NGO field staff for information and provision of relief
- Assign territorial area to prevent duplicity
- Keep record of activities of INGOs/ NGOs/ Donors and Philanthropists

7) **BREACHING COMMITTEE**

In pursuance of Notification No. SO(Floods)-VII-33/97 dated 15-07-2015, a Breaching Committee as constituted under the said notification will decide if and when a breach is to be made.

8) **POST FLOOD ARRANGEMENTS**

At this stage, the following activities among others shall be undertaken by the District

i) **Assessing Losses**

- The following departments i.e. revenue, agriculture & livestock and irrigation shall carry out a joint survey to determine loss of human life, livestock, crops, houses and watercourses etc.
- The Irrigation Department shall determine extent of damages incurred to embankments and canal distributions
- Provincial Highways and Buildings Department of the District shall assess damage to roads network and government infrastructure such as buildings etc

ii) **Timely Dispensation of Compensation amounts announced for affectees**

- An independent assessment shall be carried out to determine entitlement to compensation on account of being a flood affectee
- Sums shall be distributed among the affectees in a fair and open manner after completion of codal formalities laid down for the purpose

iii) Rehabilitation of Flood Affectees

- Flood affectees shall be transported back to their homes with sufficient dry ration
- An all out effort by the District shall be made to mobilise the community for rebuilding homes of the affectees

9) COORDINATION AMONG DISTRICTS

In the face of natural disaster, help and assistance goes beyond territorial boundaries and rules of jurisdiction. Where one district is hit by calamity, neighboring districts offer their services. This generosity goes a long way in building ties between people of various localities who come together to ward off the worst possible effects of a natural disaster such as a flood. Keeping this spirit alive, a coordination network among neighboring districts will be designed where they will share information as to available resources and possible line of action to be adopted depending upon the situation
