INTRODUCTION

District Okara was created in 1982, consists of 933 villages with area of 1085615 acres. Okara district lies at an approximate elevation of 500 feet above the sea level. River Ravi forms the northern boundary of the District whereas River Sutlej flows on the southern boundary of the District. Both the Rivers pass through this district. Across the River Ravi lie the districts of Faisalabad and Sheikhpura. Across the River Sutlej lie the district Ferozpur of India and some portion of District Bahawalnagar.

2. The flood season normally starts from 15th June and continues up to second week of October. In order to deal with the situation effectively, preparations start from June and last till the end of October. The remedial and relief action is accordingly designed to attend to the aftermath of rain and rivers in floods. Strenuous efforts are made to mobilize all human and material resources in order to pre-empt disaster situation and also carry out relief activities in a systematic manner. To achieve this goal, a detailed Flood Disaster & Relief Plan has been prepared to save and protect the life and property of the marooned people in case of flood emergency, keeping in view the guidelines / instructions received from the PDMA / Relief Department, Board of Revenue, Government of the Punjab.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this plan are:-

1. To evacuate the flood affected people from the flood affected areas and their transportation to the safe places / relief camps.
2. To protect installations, infrastructure, machinery and stocks e.g. roads, railway tracks, bridges, power installations, gas pipelines, irrigation works, tube wells, etc.
3. To pre-empt danger and threat to life and property of the marooned people
4. To provide guidance to the Government functionaries engaged in relief and operational activities.
5. To streamline the role of various Government Agencies and private organizations to ensure prompt and timely action.

CHAPTER I

BRIEF HISTORY OF PAST FLOODS EVENTS

1. RIVER SUTLEJ:

- a. After the transfer of water rights exclusively to India, River Sutlej is a dormant river now. The fluvial morphology of this has been hampered. The trapping of base flow resulted in flattening and accretion of river bed, thereby loosing the discharging capacity of the river channel. This phenomenon is yielding higher flood heights at lower discharges resulting in large scale inundation when India releases sudden flood discharge which is in excess of their storage capacity.
- b. During 1988, a peak flood of 3,99,543 cusec was experienced at outfall site of B.S.Link. The main creek was shifted toward the tail structure and consequently, the water over-ran the spurs and the shank of spur No. I and it was bisected. The river also found its way from behind the spur, which was tied with the insufficient high land instead of canal bank. Even the canal bank of B.S. Link II did not have the required free board. The stone aprons, pitching and shanks of spur No.II & III were damaged. The spur No.I, however, remained high and dry. The damages were repaired. According to the latest model studies a project under FPSP-II has been implemented, constructing a guide head spur and a mole head spur. No high floods after 1988 have been experienced in this river Sutlej.

2. RIVER RAVI:

- a. Flood damages in this area have an old history which starts from the year 1955. During the year 1955 a heavy flood in River Ravi at Balloki Headworks was recorded as 204360 cusecs. A big area and infrastructure was damaged in Okara and Renala Tehsils.
- b. Similarly in 1957, the River Ravi with its discharge of 180205 cusecs at Balloki badly affected various villages in Okara district. Again in 1988, an unprecedented discharge of about 389345 cusecs in Ravi at Balloki Headworks caused heavy damages to human and animal lives, crops and houses. The town of Renala Khurd and Basti Lal Shah were also affected due to breach in LBDC.

CHAPTER II

GEOGRAPHICAL FEATURES, AREA & POPULATION

1. GEOGRAPHICAL FEATURES:

District Okara is located between two rivers, i.e. River Ravi and River Sutlej. It is bounded on the North by the river Ravi, separating it from the districts of Nankana & Faisalabad, on the Southern side is district Pakpattan, on the East bounded by the River Sutlej separating it from district Kasur and on the West is district Sahiwal, having distance as follows:-

(a) North	District Nankana Sahb	(75 Kms)


DISTRICT FLOOD RELIEF COMMITTEE

1. There shall be a District Flood Relief Committee headed by the Deputy Commissioner, Okara. The main function of the Flood Relief Committee will be to arrange and supervise the relief activities for flood affected people.

CHAPTER IV

FLOOD CODES

The following codes shall be communicated to the District Flood Control Centre by the Irrigation Department according to the discharge of water in the rivers:-

CHAPTER V

DISTRICT FLOOD CONTROL CENTRE

1. District Flood Control Centre will be established on the phone No. 044-9200036 as per situation warrants under the supervision of Additional Deputy Commissioner (Rev), Okara. It will be manned round the clock.

2. The District Flood Control Centre on receipt of "**FLOOD WARNING**" shall immediately convey the same to the Tehsil Flood Control Centers for onward information of the Sector and Sub Sector Incharges for taking appropriate action and for the information of the residents of the likely flood affected areas through the quickest possible means. The District Flood Control Centre shall also pass on such information in writing to the following officers:-

- (a) The Deputy Commissioner, Okara
- (b) The District Police Officer, Okara.
- (c) The Executive Engineers, Irrigation LBDC, Head Suleimanki, Head Balloki and Khanwah

3. **PROCEDURE DURING "LOW FLOOD".**

The District Flood Control Centre, Okara shall be at all times ready to respond as follows:-

- (a) Send information to the Tehsil Flood Control Centers.
- (b) Mobilize appropriate number of personnel.
- (c) Inform all officials and implementing agencies concerned.
- (d) Use the communication facilities available, both Government and that of non-Government whichever is the quickest.
- (e) Contact the agency issuing "**Low Flood**" information to obtain clarification and approximate time and estimated intensity of flood as well as probable degree of occurrence.
- (f) Contact the responsible officers in the areas threatened of flood and communicate the obtained information to all concerned.
- (g) Discuss and check the state of preparedness with the actions to be taken.

4. PROCEDURE DURING MEDIUM FLOOD

In case of the information received regarding the Medium Flood, by the District Flood Control Centre, the centre will be responsible:-

- (a) To send information to Tehsil Flood Control Centers.
- (b) To mobilize all personnel with all possible speed.
- (c) To inform all officials and implementing agencies concerned and request them to take immediate appropriate action.
- (d) To use communication facilities available, both Government and that of non-Government whichever is quickest.
- (e) To contact the agency issuing the **"Medium Flood"** warning for further information.
- (f) To contact the responsible officers in the area threatened and communicate obtained information, enquire about the local situation and discuss the possible needs of probable disaster victims and estimate the net requirements.
- (g) To discuss and determine appropriate actions to be taken.
- (h) To execute the determined action.
- (i) To organize the control centre on twenty four hours basis of readiness.

5. PROCEDURE DURING HIGH FLOOD / DANGER.

Upon receipt of high flood / danger warning the District Control Centre shall be responsible:-

- (a) To inform the concerned Tehsil Flood Control Centre and all implementing agencies concerned requesting them to take appropriate actions and execute their emergency plan.
- (b) To dispatch Rescue and Evacuation teams to the affected areas for rescue operations and for verification of disaster's intensity, preliminary assessment of losses and damages etc.
- (c) To contact the Tehsil Flood Supervisory Staff and responsible Sector Officers in the affected areas by telephone or by other sources of communication to obtain information/ clarification of situation and assistance required.
- (d) To determine appropriate actions on the basis of available information.
- (e) To execute the determined actions.
- (f) The implementing agencies shall, upon receipt of information of disaster/ occurrence requiring immediate assistance, execute the respective plans without delay.

CHAPTER VI

TEHSIL FLOOD CONTROL CENTERS

1. There are three Tehsils of District Okara i.e. Okara, Depalpur and Renala Khurd. Flood Control Centers at Tehsil headquarters shall also be established under the supervision of the respective Assistant Commissioners as detailed below:-

2. **DUTIES & FUNCTIONS**

The Assistant Commissioners will be responsible for the flood relief measures in their respective Tehsils, as follows:-

- (a) To ensure that the flood warning received from the District Flood Control Centre is passed on to Sector and Sub Sector In charges.
- (b) To ensure that the flood warnings and messages are quickly passed on to the villages likely to be affected.
- (c) On receipt of information regarding **extra ordinary high flood**, the concerned Assistant Commissioner will move their headquarters to the dangerous point and remain there till the flood subsides.
- (d) To issue necessary instructions to the staff to effectively mitigate the sufferings of marooned people.
- (e) To communicate the flood situation and the relief measures taken by him to the District Flood Control Centre for the information of the District Government through the quickest possible means.
- (f) To keep himself in touch with the headquarters by wireless, telephone or any other means available at the spot.
- (g) To ensure submission of daily situation report to the District Headquarters.

CHAPTER VII

DETAIL OF FLOOD SECTORS & SUB SECTORS

1. The District Okara has been divided into 12 Sectors & 12 Sub Sectors for flood warning and relief activities and 12 Relief Camps shall be established where the SHO concerned, Veterinary Officer, Medical Officer, representatives of Irrigation, Municipal Committees and Education Departments will be present round the clock to assist the Sector Officer in performance of flood emergency duties.

DUTIES OF SECTOR INCHARGES

The Sector Incharges shall be responsible for carrying out the following duties:-

- (a) To carry out the survey of the area of their respective jurisdiction for flood relief and point out problems likely to be faced by the people of the area, so that these should be resolved well before the rainy season starts.
- (b) To inspect the buildings, earmarked for establishment of relief camps by 15th of June and submit their report to the respective Assistant Commissioners that buildings are fit for human dwelling and basic necessities i.e. electricity, water supply, etc. are available on the spot.
- (c) To carry out the survey of spurs and bunds falling within their area of responsibility along-with the representatives of Irrigation Department, that all the spurs and bunds are intact and necessary repairs have been carried out well before the flood season starts.
- (d) Every Sector Officer should fully acquaint himself with the problems of the area, means of communication in his sector beforehand so that he is well informed of his area of jurisdiction to meet any emergency effectively.
- (e) To inform the residents of the villages that their villages are attached with their sectors and where the relief camps are situated. In case of emergency they may contact the sector Incharge.
- (f) To give wide publicity to the flood warning situation in every village in his circle and to ensure that the inhabitants of every village get correct information about the floods, in case the circumstances require so.
- (g) To make necessary arrangements for evacuation of the population residing in the dangerous zones.
- (h) To provide food to the flood victims and also fodder (dry or green) to their cattle heads.
- (i) To keep informed of the situation to the District/ Tehsil Flood Control Centers through the quickest possible means for the information of the quarters concerned.
- (j) To Keep constant watch over flood situation and carry out survey of the area of his responsibility to assess the damages caused due to flood to human beings/ their cattle heads, property and the standing crops etc. and also maintain daily diary.
- (k) To ensure vaccination/ inoculation of the flood stricken people and their cattle heads against epidemics.

CHAPTER VIII

LIAISON WITH ARMY

A thorough survey of flood protection bunds and canal banks including explosive liner shall be carried out with the coordination of army authorities and irrigation authorities. The Assistant Commissioners will keep close liaison with the Army Authorities responsible for flood rescue operation for District Okara. The Army Authorities are being requested to keep at least one unit of Army Jawans in the district, ready to meet any eventuality, in case of flood emergency.

CHAPTER IX

CONTROL OF LAW AND ORDER SITUATION

1. Experience shows that whenever any flood emergency arises, inhabitants of the area try to cut the protection bund at upstream to divert the flood threat from their locality. In such a situation it would be necessary for District Administration to provide.
 - (a) Adequate day and night patrolling to guard against any attempt to stealthily cutting a bund or structure.
 - (b) Adequate provision of Police Force for any open and defiant attempt of breaching the bund at any place.
2. In such situations, the District Police Officer, Okara would be responsible to promptly provide adequate police force on being apprised of the situation by the Executive Engineer concerned, through Deputy Commissioner, Okara.
3. Moreover, all the SHOs of the Police Stations in the district would be responsible for deputing sufficient police force on sensitive points, in this regard, suo-moto, or on the requisition of Assistant Commissioners and Sector Incharge of the concerned areas.
4. The District Police Officer, Okara is requested to chalk out a Flood Fighting / Evacuation Plan, in line with this plan and provide a copy thereof, to the Deputy Commissioner, Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) and all the Assistant Commissioners in the district.
5. He is also requested to pass on necessary directions to all the SHOs of Police Stations in the district to depute police force, without any delay, on the requisition of the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Assistant Commissioners and Sector Incharges as and when required.

CHAPTER X

LOCATION OF WIRELESS SETS

1. The wireless sets will be available on the following points for communication of flood messages:-

- (a) Office of the Addl. Deputy Commissioner (Rev) / District Flood Control Centre.
- (b) Office of the Assistant Commissioner / Tehsil Flood Control Centers.
- (c) Police Lines Okara.
- (d) With all the Sector Incharges

2. These sets will be connected with Head-Sulemanki, Head-Balloki and AIG Telecommunication Lahore. All messages will be received and disseminated to the quarters concerned.

3. The District Police Officer, Okara is requested to install wireless sets in the vehicles of Deputy Commissioner, Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) and all ACs in the District along with providing Walki Talkis to all the officers mentioned above in addition to all the Sector In charges.

CHAPTER XI

DISASTER & RELIEF CONTROL CENTRE

1. To monitor the flood situation in the district and to coordinate with all the agencies involved in flood emergency / relief operations, a **Disaster & Relief Control Centre** has been established in this district under the supervision of the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Okara who has been designated as Liaison Officer / Focal Person on behalf of the District Administration, Okara. Here the moment to moment change in the situation will be recorded and close watch on the discharge of rivers and streams will be kept. Information regarding discharge position of Rivers will be received from the following:-

(a) RIVER RAVI

1. XEN IRRIGATION, HEAD BALLOKI
2. XEN IRRIGATION, LBDC OKARA

(b) RIVER SUTLEJ

XEN HEAD SULEIMANKI

2. All type of information in this behalf shall be passed on to the Liaison Officer and all sort of information relating to flood emergency can be obtained from him regarding District Okara.

3. The Liaison Officer will implement all the decisions taken by the Coordinating Section and also determine the employment of the disaster services at the District and Tehsil levels. He shall also ensure the implementation of the operational plan and monitor and control the progress or actions along with procurement of additional resources, if necessary. He shall prepare situation reports and final reports after termination of operation. He will also maintain the record of losses and damages of lives and properties during disaster through Assistant Commissioners. The Liaison Officer will be assisted by the Assistant Commissioners, Okara, Depalpur and Renala Khurd.

CHAPTER XII

ORGANIZATION OF DISASTER & RELIEF CONTROL CENTRE

Disaster & Relief Control Centre will consist of the following sections:-

1. COORDINATION SECTION

This section will function directly under the supervision of the Deputy Commissioner, Okara. He will be assisted by the District Police Officer, Okara and all the Chief Executive Officers. The function of this section is to evaluate the disaster situation and decide the actions to be taken to meet the flood emergency, to provide financial assistance and to ensure timely submission of reports to the Provincial Government.

2. RESOURCES SECTION

The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Finance & Planning) shall be designated as **Officer Incharge Resources** and he shall be assisted by the XEN Provincial Highway, Deputy Director (Agriculture) and Additional Deputy Commissioner (General). This section shall:-

- (a) Assess the needs and logistics before the disaster.
- (b) Supply the same during the disaster.
- (c) Look after & avoid losses to livestock and property.

Similarly the following logistics shall be looked after by the heads of the Department given against each:-

(1)	Food Stuff	District Food Controller, Okara
(2)	Clothing	District Officer (Social Welfare)
(3)	Medical Supplies/ Ambulances	Chief Executive Officer, District Health Authority
(4)	Shelters	Officer Incharge Resources
(5)	Construction Material	XEN Provincial Highway, Chief Officers of MCs and Civil Defense Officer.
(6)	Machinery & Equipment	Deputy Director (Agriculture), XEN Provincial Highway, All Chief Officers of MCs.
(7)	Transport (Boats/Vehicles)	Assistant Commissioners/ Secretary District Regional Transport Authority.
(8)	Rescue Vehicles/ Ambulance.	District Emergency Officer (1122).

3. OPERATION SECTION

This section shall comprise of an Assistant Commissioner designated as Officer In charge Floods. He shall implement the decisions taken by the Coordination Section. He shall also determine the employment of the Disaster Services (at District and Tehsil levels). He shall also

implement the existing operational plans after approval by the coordination section. He shall monitor and control the progress of actions and procure employment of additional resources. He shall prepare situation reports and final reports upon termination of operations. He will also assess the loss and damages of life and property during disaster through Revenue Field Staff and submit the same to the District Flood Relief Officer.

4. DISASTER SERVICES SECTION

Six disaster services shall be set up at District and Tehsil levels for making use of the personnel and resources of the implementing agencies. These services shall be as under:-

- (a) Rescue and Evacuation Service
- (b) Health Service
- (c) Transport Service
- (d) Communication Service
- (e) Relief & Welfare Service
- (f) Security Service

a. Rescue & Evacuation Service:

The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) and Assistant Commissioners, Okara, Depalpur & Renala Khurd shall organize rescue/evacuation teams to undertake rescue/evacuation operations in the affected areas and in case of need to render assistance in adjacent areas. Total 12 Teams shall be organized (1-Team for each Sector) for this purpose. Every team shall comprise of the following:-

These teams shall work under the command of Sector Incharges (mentioned in Chapter VII of the plan) and be deployed, as and when required, in the affected area. When the emergency goes beyond the capacity of the local teams, the Sector Incharge shall report the

matter to the Assistant Commissioner concerned for deputing further teams in the affected areas.

Upon information about occurrence of a disaster which requires immediate assistance, the Control Centre will dispatch without undue delay, advance party which shall begin the rescue operations and give an immediate preliminary report containing required quantum of assistance, to the Control Centre.

b. Health Service:

The Chief Executive Officer, District Health Authority, Okara shall be responsible for providing health services in case of flood emergency. He shall:-

- i. Organize all medical facilities. He will train medical and allied personnel and ensure the availability of necessary medicines equipment and other medical supplies e.g. blood plasma and medical fluids for the victims of disaster.
- ii. Along with his field staff shall provide first aid and medical care, establish medical posts at vulnerable points and relief centers, organize mobile teams, and ensure that adequate supplies of medicines, vaccines and medical equipments are available in the District. He shall also assist in chlorination of drinking water and ensure proper sanitation in relief centers.
- iii. Arrange pre-flood inoculation in the district. He should depute vaccinators for this job. The operation must start from 1st July. Arrange to send medical aids at the relief centers in rural areas. Temporary dispensaries will be opened at suitable places.
- iv. Establishment of Static Medical Posts

The Chief Executive Officer, District Health Authority will be responsible for establishing Static Medical posts at suitable places within the vicinity of flood – prone villages which shall cater health related needs of people living within the jurisdiction of following union councils:

For River Ravi:

- i. Union Council Mupalkay (Tatar)
- ii. Union Council Jandraka (Tariqabad)
- iii. Union Council Fatehpur (Thatha Baig)
- iv. Union Council Kund Bohar
- v. Union Council Thatha Bhatian
- vi. Union Council Gogera

For River Sutlej:

- i. Union Council Attari

- ii. Union Council Rohaila Tejekay (Puran)
- iii. Union Council Jamal Kot (Dhranga)
- iv. Union Council Malhu Sheikhu ka
- v. Union Council Sujakay
- vi. Union Council Sulemanki

c. Transport Service:

- i. There shall be transport cell at District Headquarters under the charge of Secretary DRTA, Okara and General Assistant Revenue, Okara designated as Transport Officer. This cell in addition to the existing transport shall requisition vehicles from other Departments and private sector as per requirement.
- ii. The transport service shall manage and control all available transportation facilities to ensure their appropriate and efficient utilization in the disaster area. All requests for transport from different agencies shall be forwarded to the Transport cell at telephone No. 044-9200036. This office shall also work round the clock during emergency.

d. Functions of Transportation Cell

This cell shall be responsible:-

- i. To keep inventory of all available vehicles i.e. earth moving machinery, scrapers, bulldozers, Government and private, including the location, capacity, address of owners and agreement executed in advance etc.
- ii. As the coordinating section to supply additional transport from nearby areas in case of need emergency.
- iii. Demand the following information where the transport is required. Name and location of requesting party, time of pickup and place, nature, weight and volume of expected load, loading points areas, destination etc.
- iv. Determine the type of vehicles / transport and number of vehicles needed in each case.
- v. Request/ reports on the utilization of transportation and file of reports.
- vi. Decide the priorities of usage of available transportation facilities.
- vii. Truck/Tractor Trolleys will be requisitioned for the transportation of flood relief good to the rural areas. The jeeps belonging to government departments will also be requisitioned for flood duty and POL charges will be borne by the Board of Revenue Punjab and relief wing.

e. **COMMUNICATION SERVICE**

i. The District Police Officer in association with Sub Divisional Officer, Telephones will be Incharge of the Communication Service. There shall be wireless sets and special flood telephones placed in the Disaster Control Centre which will run round the clock.

ii. **Functions of Communication Service**

- To establish all links on request from the Coordination Section.
- To coordinate, direct and control communications under the guidance of the coordination section.
- To provide all assistance and support to the agency furnishing communications facilities.
- To inform immediately upon receipt of **“Flood warnings”** all agencies concerned about the possible need of additional communication facilities and request preparations to be made for speedy action, if required by further developments.
- To keep a list of individuals and agencies to be immediately informed upon receipt of **“Flood Warnings”**.

f. **Relief and Welfare Service:**

This agency shall be organized by the respective Assistant Commissioners and Chief Officers of MCs concerned. They shall mobilize all their resources for the help of affected people. The Sector Incharge will assist the Assistant Commissioner concerned for providing relief to the flood affectees and their welfare.

6. RELIEF CAMPS:

In order to provide relief and protection to the flood affected persons in the District, Relief Camps will be established at the following places, by the Sector Incharges:-

7. WELFARE OF THE FLOOD AFFECTED PEOPLE:

To look after the welfare of the flood affected people the relief and welfare service shall:-

- a) Make an immediate survey of the affected areas and make a list of victims individuals and families.
- b) Provide food and other basic necessities to victims on individual or family basis during emergency period.
- c) Establish immediate emergency mass feeding.
- d) Assist in the evacuation of population from dangerous zones to safer places.
- e) Establish, administer and supervise relief centers in schools, municipal buildings and tents etc. as a temporary shelter to homeless victims.
- f) Record the hospitalized, the dead, injured and missing persons.
- g) Attend to local and international welfare inquires about persons in disaster areas.
- h) Respond to locating family members of victims and provide facilitation for reunion of dislocated families.
- i) Provide useful knowledge and skill to victims to help them return to normal life.
- j) Coordinate with other disaster services and distribute the donations in kind, duly collected for this purpose.

- 8. SECURITY SERVICE:**
- (a) Security Service shall work under the direct control of the District Police Officer, Okara; it shall include all the Assistant Commissioners and Sub Divisional Police Officers at Tehsil level. A liaison officer from the Army/Rangers and the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) as liaison officer with the Army/Rangers shall also be included in this service.
 - (b) This department shall ensure law & order and security at the evacuation points near affected areas, Relief Centers, Stores and Godowns etc.
 - (c) In case of damage caused to roads by floods, the District Police Officer will plan alternate route for the smooth flow of traffic. He will also ensure that adequate police force is deputed as and where required by the District Administration.
 - (d) The District Police Officer, Okara shall ensure that sufficient police force is deployed on sensitive installations, bunds, bridges and head works etc.

CHAPTER XIII

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES & SUPPORT FUNCTIONS OF IMPLEMENTING AGENCIES

- 1. AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT**
- a. The Deputy Director (Agriculture), Okara will be Incharge of his department with the assignments to help the Irrigation Department in the supply of earthmoving machinery for protection of embankment. He will ensure the availability of seeds, fertilizers, agriculture implements on credit basis to the farmers for sowing of crops. He will further ensure that the Live Stock & Dairy Development Wing provides veterinary care, take preventive steps against cattle diseases, supervise purchase of fodder and ensure grazing for evacuated cattle heads.
 - b. After the flood water recedes, it will be necessary to make immediate arrangement for the provision of seed. The Assistant Commissioner of the concerned Tehsil will give necessary details regarding approximate quantity of seed required in their respective Tehsils. The Deputy Director (Agriculture) will make necessary arrangements to open special depots for provision of these seeds at suitable places in the District for sowing of ensuing wheat crop with the help of Food Department.

3. FOOD DEPARTMENT

The District Food Controller will ensure that the stocks of wheat are available in the PR Centers and that no stock is dispatched out of the District. He will send proposals to the Deputy Commissioner for opening of new PR Centers in close vicinity of flood affected areas. In case of flood emergency the District Food Controller will ensure that there is no scarcity of food grains. If there is any shortage of food he will make immediate arrangements for supply of the same. He will also arrange the seeds for sowing of wheat crop and will open depot for supply to the flood affectees with the assistance of Deputy Director (Agriculture).

4. CIVIL DEFENSE:

a. Evacuation

The Civil Defense Officer will assist the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Okara for the evacuation of flood affectees. He will arrange Qaumi Razakars and place their services at the disposal of ADC (Revenue). The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) will depute these persons with the Assistant Commissioner concerned who will depute them with Sector Incharges, appointed for this purpose.

b. Provision of Boats

The District Officer (Civil Defense) and SHO concerned would ensure deployment of private boats at the places to be intimated to them by the Sector Incharges at the time of flood emergency.

5. RESCUE- 1122 EMERGENCY SERVICE

The Rescue Service 1122 has been introduced in this district, having **90** well trained rescuers and **25** fully equipped Ambulances, 01 Rescue Vehicle (14-Fiber Boats, 162-life jackets, 10-life rings), 04-fire vehicles and 01-general duty van. 04-Rescue Posts will be deputed on River Sutlej and 03 Rescue Posts on River Ravi. Each rescue Post will comprise of 05 rescuers and one fully equipped emergency kit bag to provide first aid on the spot alongwith Fiber Boat &

OBM Engine, life saving jackets, life buoys, life rings with floatable ropes, oxygen cylinders and floating stretchers. One fully equipped ambulance & Fire Vehicle will be deployed on each of the river (Ravi & Sutlej) at suitable locations keeping in view the flood situation.

6. ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT (MECHANICAL)

The Assistant Agricultural Engineer will control this agency and provide machines and material for repair of bulldozers and tractors working for the repair or protection of embankment and also open workshops near the vulnerable points.

7. INFORMATION DEPARTMENT:

Under the District Information Officer the department shall ensure that Print and Electronic Media and the public receive correct information about "***flood situation***" messages. He shall also plan and arrange the visits of the persons from Print & Electronic Media to the flood affected areas.

8. IRRIGATION DEPARTMENT:

This department shall supervise, direct and control embankments protection activities and shall also control various canals in the District. It will also be responsible for ensuring that correct flood situation is conveyed to the District Flood Control Centre in time so that timely action can be initiated as warranted by the situation.

9. MUNICIPAL COMMITTEES:

All the Municipal Committees will be responsible for:-

a. **Provision of Clean Drinking Water:**

Respective Municipal Committee shall be responsible for providing clean drinking water in affected areas and at relief centers. They shall also keep adequate supply of spare parts for repair of wells and tube wells.

b. **Sanitation:**

All the MCs will also be responsible for maintenance of satisfactory sanitary condition in the relief camps.

c. **Availability of Dewatering Sets:**

Municipal Committees are already having dewatering sets to pump out the rain / flood water, accumulated in low lying areas/ depressions. They should repair them (if needed) before the start of rainy / flood season i.e. before 15th June.

10. WAPDA (LESCO):

The Superintending Engineer, WAPDA (LESCO), Okara shall make necessary light arrangements on the embankments for night patrolling and protection activities. He shall also ensure orderly and regular supply of power throughout the District during emergency. In case of power failure he will arrange electric generator sets as per requirement of the District Government.

11. VOLUNTARY AGENCIES

Hilal-e-Ahmar & International Aid Giving Agencies

In addition to the agencies mentioned above there are quite a few voluntary social welfare agencies. A list of such agencies will be prepared by the District Officer (Social Welfare) and furnished to the District Flood Relief Officer, Okara. Such agencies will provide equipment and supply relief material, assist in food distribution and collection of funds and articles for relief purpose and also assist in training of personnel for relief activities, first aid and in running relief centers.

CHAPTER XIV

GENERAL ACTIVITIES

1. RELIEF ARTICLES /STORES

During flood emergency various organizations / individuals come forward with various items of relief for flood victims. For storage of such articles, a Depot will be set up at District level in the premises of District Complex, Okara. The Assistant Commissioner, Okara will be nominated as the Incharge of such Depot / stores. At Tehsil level such stores will also be set up by the Assistant Commissioners concerned. On receipt of requirements from the Sector Incharges, the Assistant Commissioners / Incharge of the stores will arrange the dispatch of relief goods to the relief camps. Cooperation and assistance from various social organizations like EDHI, SAHARA, Anjuman Falah-e-Mareezan, Hilal-e-Ahmer etc. will be welcomed.

2. POST FLOOD RELIEF MEASURES

As soon as the flood water recedes, relief in the form of grant of Gracious Relief / Taccavi Loans etc. will be started under the supervision of the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) and Assistant Commissioner concerned.

3. TACCAVI LOANS

In consultation with the Tehsildar, the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) will immediately collect the approximate requirements of Taccavi Loans for the following categories of demands and move the Relief Commissioner for allocation of funds:-

- Seeds
- Repair and construction of houses.
- Purchase of bullocks.
- Purchase of fodder.

4. GRACIOUS RELIEF

(a) The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) will immediately report the amount of gracious relief to be given for:-

- Loss of life.
- Loss of cattle.
- Loss of property.

(b) The following categories of flood affected persons will be entitled to receive the grant of subject relief to the limit as fixed by the Government:-

- Widows.
- Orphans.
- Dependents of those who lost their lives.
- Landless tenants.
- Unskilled labour.

(c) Proper account on the subject will be kept by the Tehsildar concerned.

5. RELIEF GOODS

Arrangements will be made for the distribution of relief articles among following category of flood affected persons:-

- Widows and orphans.
- Landless tenants.
- Unskilled labor.

6. REMISSION OF LAND REVENUE

The question of remission of land revenue will be taken up after the joint Girdawari of flood affected areas by the Revenue and Irrigation authorities. The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) will be responsible for this job.



STRATEGY TO EVACUATE PEOPLE RESIDING INSIDE RIVER / CANAL BEDS

Two Eastern Rivers namely Ravi & Sutlej flow through District Okara which are basically dry as India enjoys exclusive rights over their waters as per Indus waters treaty of 1960. These rivers attain high flood in case of heavy rainfall in their catchment areas and subsequent release of water by India from dams located upstream. District Flood Control Room remains operative round the clock during flood season and monitors water flow at upstream / downstream of Balloki & Suleimanki and also remains in touch with Pakistan Meteorological Department / PDMA.

It is pertinent to mention here that very few population resides inside river beds who have permanent settlements at safer places in their respective villages. Whenever flood warning is received, response timings range from 48 to 72 hours which is sufficient to relocate these vulnerable people to safer places. Consequently, prompt announcements over loudspeakers are made, whereby people are requested to immediately vacate their current premises and move either to relief camps or their permanent settlements. Assistance of Police is also requisitioned in case people refuse to move from river beds. Rescue 1122 has played commendable role over the past few years by establishing rescue posts of vulnerable points and shifting the people to safer places by employing Motor Boats. And last but not the least, liaison with army authorities always remains in place to mitigate harmful impact of flood eventuality as the case may be.

DEPLOYMENT PLAN WITH REGARD TO EVACUATION (ARRANGEMENTS ON THE PART OF RESCUE 1122)

04 Rescue Posts will be established at River Sutlej and 03 Rescue Posts at River Ravi.

1. RIVER SUTLEJ

04 Rescue Posts of River Sutlej (02 RPs upstream & 02 RPs downstream of Suleimanki Head works) will give emergency services and evacuate the flood-trapped people from 08 vulnerable points which are as under:-

3. FORMULATION OF RESCUE POSTS

Each post will comprise of 05 rescuers and one fully equipped fiber boat & OBM engine, emergency kit bag to provide first aid on the spot along with life saving jackets, life buoys and life rings with floatable ropes.

One fully equipped Ambulance will be deployed at each of the river (River Ravi & Sutlej) at suitable locations keeping in view the flood situation. Rescue Vehicle along with small engine boat will be at backup and may be deployed as the need may be.

DETAIL OF ENCROACHMENTS

As per flood fighting plans submitted by the XEN Irrigation Balloki and Suleimanki currently no encroachments exist on any flood works within their jurisdiction.
