**Pakistan Meteorological Department - Weather Update**

Mainly hot and dry weather is expected in most districts of the province. However, rain-windstorm/thunderstorm is likely in Murree, Galliyat, Rawalpindi, Attock, Jhelum, Chakwal, Bhakkar, Mianwali, Noorpur Thal, Sargodha, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Sialkot and Narowal during evening/night. Rain-windstorm/thunderstorm is also expected in D.G. Khan, Multan, Khanewal and Bahawalpur during the period.






**Rain Forecast 09.05.2024 (06:00PM)**
