Pakistan Meteorological Department - Weather Update

Mainly hot and dry weather is expected in most districts of the province, while very hot/gusty-dust raising winds in central and southern districts. Whoever, rain-windstorm/thunderstorm are expected at isolated places in Rawalpindi, Attock, Jhelum, Chakwal, Sargodha, Mianwali, Khushab, Bhakkar and Noorpur Thal during evening/night. Partly cloudy weather conditions with rain-wind/thunderstorm may occur in Murree, Galliyat and surrounding areas during evening/night.






Rainfall Forecast 16.05.2024 (06:00PM)
