Due to the significant impact of forest fires on local temperatures, it is imperative that the relevant authorities maintain vigilance and swiftly mobilize the Rescue 1122 firefighting teams along with the forest department's fire combating squad. Prompt action is crucial to extinguish these fires promptly and mitigate their contribution to escalating temperatures.

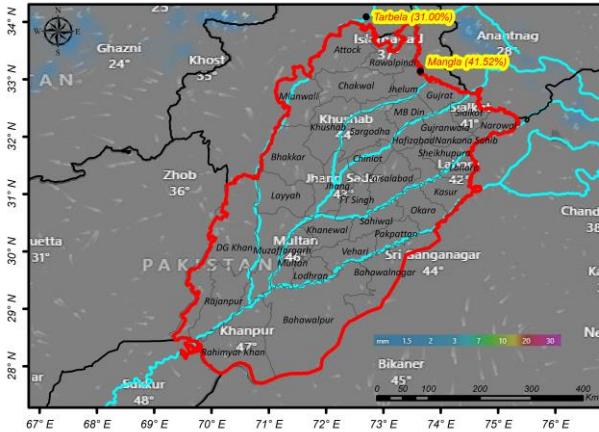


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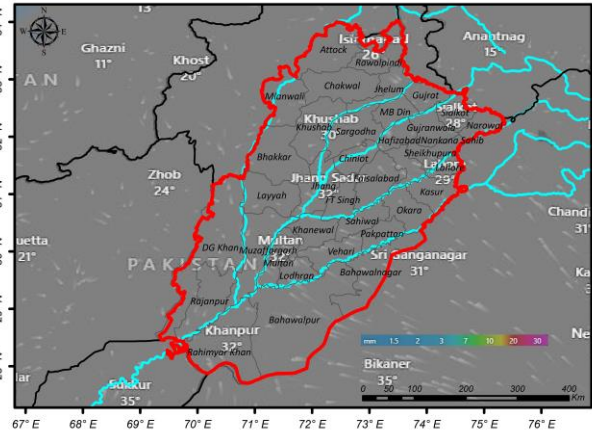
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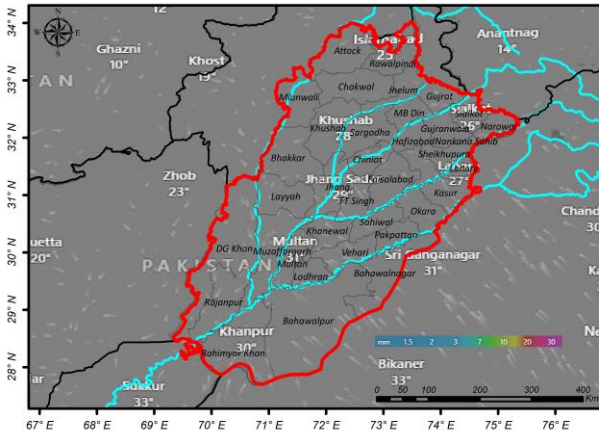
Rain Forecast 23.05.2024 (06:00 PM)



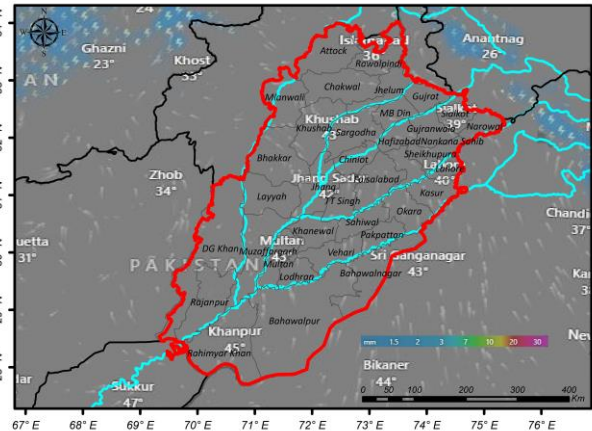
Rain Forecast 24.05.2024 (12:00 AM)
