Pakistan Meteorological Department - Weather Update

Cold weather is expected in most districts of the province, while Cloudy in upper districts. Rain is likely in Attock, Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Chakwal, Sargodha, Mianwali, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Narowal, Mandi Bahauddin, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Faisalabad, Lahore and Kasur.

SNOWFALL – Murree District

Moderate to heavy rain with snow is expected in Murree and Galliyat.

FOG

Shallow to moderate fog is likely to persist in Bahawalpur, Sahiwal, Okara, Kasur, Jhang, Sargodha, Toba Tek Singh, Khanewal, Multan, Khanpur, Rahimyar Khan, Dera Ghazi Khan and surrounding during morning hours.
