**SUBJECT: HEATWAVE CONDITIONS ARE LIKELY TO SUBSIDE DURING THE WEEK. DUST THUNDERSTORM RAIN PREDICTED IN UPPER PARTS FROM 4<sup>TH</sup> JUNE TO 7<sup>TH</sup> JUNE, 2024**

**1. Weather Situation:**

Met office has informed (vide letter: NWFC-5(10A)/2017/77, Dated: 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2024) that a shallow westerly wave is likely to enter upper and central parts of the country on Tuesday (Evening /night) and may persist during next 03 days. Under the influence of this weather system, **Duststorm/thunderstorm with rain** is expected in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Kasur, Okara, Sheikhpura, Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh, Jhang, Khushab, Sargodha and Mianwali from **04<sup>th</sup> June to 06<sup>th</sup> June with occasional gaps.** **Duststorm/thunderstorm with isolated rain** is also expected in Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar, D.G. Khan, Sahiwal, Multan and Layyah from **05<sup>th</sup> June (Evening/night) to 07<sup>th</sup> June.**

**2. POSSIBLE IMPACTS:**

- i. Duststorm/windstorm and lightning may affect daily routines, standing crops, loose structures like electric poles, vehicles and solar panels etc during the period.
- ii. Heatwave conditions are likely to subside in the country during the forecast period.

**3. PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES:**

- i. Ensure sufficient staffing round-the-clock in DEOCs for effective coordination and response.
- ii. Collect and share the latest information with line departments, provincial, and national authorities.
- iii. Generate Situation Reports (SITREP) to cover any major incidents/developments on regular basis.
- iv. Rescue 1122 (Disaster Response Force) to remain high alert and have sufficient emergency response personnel and equipment during the forecasted period.
- v. Establish a streamlined and efficient communication system through phone calls, SMS and announcements to ensure timely dissemination of weather forecasts, advisories, and alerts to local community through Patwaris, Lumberdars, Noteables and general announcement in Mosques.
- vi. Forewarn travelers/ visitors about risks posed from Duststorm/Thunder Storm in vulnerable locations and provide guidance and assistance in case of emergencies through local administration, police and rescue services.
- vii. Share daily / routine updates with PDMA Punjab in case of any eventuality.
- viii. NH&MP and Traffic Police to coordinate with Law Enforcement Agencies to manage and redirect traffic in affected areas to prevent congestion and facilitate emergency response efforts.
