**SUBJECT: RAIN-WIND/THUNDERSTORM PREDICTED IN UPPER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY FROM 14<sup>TH</sup> (NIGHT) TO 16<sup>TH</sup> MARCH (MORNING)**

Met office (vide Letter No. NWFC-5(10A)/2017/157) has informed that the a westerly wave is likely to approach northwestern parts of the country on Saturday (evening) and likely to persist till 16th March (morning).

Under the influence of this weather system:

- **Rain-wind/thunderstorm (isolated hailstorm)** is expected in **Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Attock, Jhelum, Chakwal, Talagang, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Sargodha, Mianwali, Sheikhpura, Gujrat, Khushab, Mandi Bahaudin, Lahore, Sialkot, Narowal, Faisalabad, Jhang, Chiniot, Bhakkar, Layyah, Dera Ghazi Khan, and surroundings** from **14<sup>th</sup> (night) to 16<sup>th</sup> March (morning)** with occasional gaps.
  - Another western disturbance is likely to approach western parts of the country on 17th March (night).
- 2. Possible Impacts:**
- Lightning strikes may occur at isolated places during the forecast period.
  - Tourists are advised to remain extra cautious and avoid unnecessary travelling during the forecast period.
  - Daytime temperatures are expected to decrease **03 to 04 °C** in upper parts of the country.
  - Farmers are advised to manage their crops according to the prevailing weather conditions.
3. In order to maintain high level of preparedness and mitigation of the disaster all the District administrations and line departments are requested to ensure the following measures:
- i. Ensure **sufficient staffing round-the-clock in DEOCs** for effective coordination and response.
  - ii. **Coordinate** with PDMA and all relevant departments to ensure **a unified prompt response**.
  - iii. Ensure accurate and timely dissemination of **information on safety measures and evacuation plans** through **electronic and social media**.
  - iv. Motorway Police shall ensure regular traffic advisories, timely updates on road conditions, and guidance to travelers for safe travel.
  - v. Deploy **additional staff** and resources to high-risk areas.
  - vi. Stay **alert Rescue 1122** and ensure pre-position search and rescue teams (DRF) along with necessary equipment
  - vii. Generate **Situation Reports (SITREPS)** to cover any major incidents/developments on regular basis.
  - viii. Ensure **data collection and reporting** for post-flood analysis and improvements.
