




# *PART – I*

## **FLOOD CONTROL SCHEME**

### **AIM.**

The aim of this plan is:-

- a: To adopt all possible measures during the off season for adequate protection against floods.
- b: To minimize the effect of flood.
- c: To undertake timely evacuation of the people and cattle heads.
- d: To provide necessary relief in terms of food, drinking water and shelter to the affectees.
- e: To ensure timely restoration of means of communication.
- f: To take effective measures regarding rehabilitation of the flood affectees.

### **COMMAND AND CONTROL.**

The Deputy Commissioner, Sargodha will act as District Flood Controller and will be responsible for coordinating and supervising the flood control and relief measures in the District. The District has been divided into 7 Sectors and 17 Sub Sectors. Each Tehsil will be a Sector, which will be headed by respective Assistant Commissioner and further sub divided into Sub Sectors. Each Sub Sector will be headed by a Revenue Officer, Tehsildar or Naib Tehsildar. Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Sargodha will be the incharge of the Flood Control Room and will monitor all

information, maintain supplies and coordinate all activities during flood emergency.

## **METHODS (PRE FLOOD ARRANGEMENTS).**

### **ROLE OF OTHER DEPARTMENTS.**

The officers of other departments will extend all possible help to meet the challenge of flood and to mitigate the sufferings of the flood affectees. A guideline regarding functions to be performed by the concerned departments is as follows:-

### **IRRIGATION DEPARTMENT.**

The Executive Engineer Irrigation, Sargodha, Kirana, Rasul and Shahpur Division will coordinate the flood fighting operations and will be available to guide and assist the District Administration in flood emergency.

Following actions must be ensured:-

- (i) All the flood protection bunds must be got inspected by the Executive Engineer, Irrigation along with their respective Assistant Commissioners and damages/repairs if any must be immediately undertaken/completed. The progress report should be furnished on the following proforma:-

- (ii) The routine repair work at Shahpur Disty, Western Feeder Disty, and Kot Naja Bunds should be completed by 31.05.2018
- (iii) The desilting and excavation work of indicated channels should be completed by 31.5.2018 and completion certificate should be forwarded to Deputy Commissioner, Sargodha by 31.05.2018. It must be ensured that embankments are strengthened and all rat holes/minor damages are repaired.
- (iv) SE Irrigation and respective XENs will ensure availability of all essential equipments and material i.e. Sand bags, Pitching stone etc. at various sites for meeting any emergency situation.
- (v) Establishment of Control Room at District Headquarter (Telephone No. and names of duty staff should also be indicated/supplied) by 31.5.2018.
- (vi) Intimation of prompt and correct information about flood should be transmitted to all concerned well in time. Early Flood warnings and daily situation Reports must be promptly communicated to the District Administration twice a day and in case of emergency it should immediately be conveyed to the authorities.

#### **DRAINAGE DEPARTMENT.**

SE Drainage, Sargodha will ensure that constant watch is being kept on all seem drains falling in Sargodha District. Breaches of all seem drains should immediately be closed. Executive Engineer Drainage Sargodha should ensure that all seem drains are safe, particularly in the light of previous experience, the weak points and breaches of FS drain and Mona drains

should be identified in co-ordination with respective Assistant Commissioners.

The same should be repaired/strengthened and excavated before 31.05.2018.

The completion report should be furnished by 31.5.2018.

### **HEALTH DEPARTMENT.**

- (i) The District Health Officer, Sargodha will ensure that people of areas likely to be affected by the flood are vaccinated for epidemic diseases much before the start of flood season.
- (ii) He will ensure that adequate numbers of doctors along with Para Medical staff are posted at each flood relief camp. The medical relief camps will be established inside the flood affected area/villages.
- (iii) He will also ensure the availability of adequate medicines of all types including anti-snake serum at the flood relief camps.
- (iv) He will constitute mobile clinic/teams to visit flood affected areas for inoculation and treatment of flood affectees on emergent basis. The duty of each staff will be assigned by name with area of responsibility. The exercise is to be completed by 15.5.2018 in co-ordination with concerned Assistant Commissioner. The completion report should be submitted to Deputy Commissioner, Sargodha by 31.5.2018.
- (iv) The Medical Superintendents of DHQ and THQs will ensure availability of duty Medical Officers at all times in their respective hospitals, Basic Health Units and Rural Health Centres. All types of medicines have to be arranged to provide relief in case of

emergency. Proper record of inoculation /vaccination should be maintained.

**LIVESTOCK AND DAIRY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.**

- (i) The District Officer (Livestock), Sargodha has to ensure that the animals are duly inoculated in the areas likely to be affected by the flood before the commencement of flood season. He has to render a completion report to this effect to the Deputy Commissioner, Sargodha by 20.5.2018. The duty of staff will be assigned by name with area of responsibility. The copies of duty roster should be supplied to Deputy Commissioner and respective Assistant Commissioners.
- (ii) During flood the District Officer (Livestock) will ensure that doctors, subordinate staff and adequate medicines are available at the relief camps for inoculation of animals and control of epidemics.
- (iii) Mobile teams will also be constituted for visiting the flood affected areas for inoculation of affected animals on emergent basis. The relief camps will be established inside the flood affected areas/villages.

**FESCO.**

- (i) The Superintending Engineer, FESCO Sargodha will ensure that his staff, fully equipped, is stationed in villages likely to be affected by the flood. The WAPDA staff will disconnect the

electric supply in the areas where safety of human beings is likely to be endangered by electric shock.

- (ii) The Superintending Engineer, FESCO will also ensure that electricity/power supply is restored without loss of time wherever it is possible to do so in a safe manner and when the situation becomes under control. The concerned SDO and other staff should remain available round the clock for duty in their respective areas.

### **FOOD DEPARTMENT.**

District Food Controller, Sargodha will ensure availability of adequate flour and food supplies are made available to the Deputy Commissioner, Sargodha on demand and on payment for providing the same to the flood affected persons. District Food Controller Sargodha should be directed to remain in contact with the Deputy Commissioner in this regard. (Contact details may be provided at Control room).

### **SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT.**

Orphans, destitute women and other vulnerable elements of the affected areas, the responsibility of the social welfare department. Their teams should be available in the affected area registering such persons and shifting them to proper places resetting up special camps for them. There would be an ongoing systematic collection, collation, analysis and interpretation of patient data.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT.**

- a) District Police Officer, Sargodha will arrange wireless set at each Sector Headquarter.
- b) Police contingents should be deputed to act as deterrence for criminals who may be attracted to such places.

## **HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT.**

- (i) SE, Highways, Sargodha will ensure that the damaged bridges are repaired and traffic highways / roads are kept in proper shape so that there is no hindrance in the normal flow of traffic. He will also ensure to keep all other highways / roads in proper shape.
- (ii) Adequate stock of crush stone and other necessary material should be kept readily available at all important points with a view to undertake repairs of damaged portions of roads on emergent basis. XEN, Highways Sargodha should keep close watch on all highways roads in Sargodha Particularly in flood areas of the district and ensure that these are kept in proper shape for normal flow of traffic. Similarly adequate number of Benley bridges must be kept readily available at all important/focal points. Also one bildozer and 3 – 4 Forward blade tractors should be kept available in each Tehsil i.e. Bhalwal, Bhera, Shahpur, Sahiwal, Sillanwali, Kot Momin and Sargodha for emergency use. The beldars should be deployed

by name with area of responsibility. The flow of traffic on following main roads must be ensured uninterrupted:-

1. Sargodha – Khushab road.
2. Sargodha – Sahiwal road.(Jehanian Shah-Chawaka Road)
3. Sargodha – Bhalwal road. (Via Mari Lak)
4. Sargodha – Bhalwal road (via Ajnala road).
5. Sargodha – Faisalabad road.
6. Sargodha – Lahore road via Bhagtanwala.
7. Bhalwal – Bhera road.
8. Shahpur – Via Chak Ramdas) Road Bhera.
9. Kot Momin- Midh Ranjha Road.
10. Sial More to Midh Ranjha Road.

### **RESTORATION OF RAILWAY TRACKS.**

Divisional Superintendent, Railway/Assistant Transportation Officer Railway, Sargodha will conduct survey of Railway tracks and ensure that all Railway tracks are in proper shape. Efforts should be made to close/repair breaches of Railway lines with a view to ensuring proper functioning of trains in Sargodha district as early as possible.

### **DEPLOYMENT OF ARMY.**

3 Air Defence, Sargodha Cantt, will assist the District Government in flood protection and flood relief operation as and when the situation goes out of control of District Administration. The army can also be called in anticipation of such an eventuality. Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Sargodha and all Assistant Commissioners and Irrigation

Department shall extend all possible administrative and logistic assistance to the Army when called in for performance of their duties. The Assistant Commissioners and District Officer, Civil Defense must ensure that adequate numbers of boats are deployed at all strategic points in co-ordination with the local Army Authorities. Assistant Commissioners are requested to work out requirement of motor boats in co-ordination with the Army and ensure proper deployment/availability of motor boat at each focal point. The deployment plan of Motor Boats will be as under:-

## **PART –II**

### **ORGANIZATION, CONTROL AND RELIEF MEASURES.**

The flood control measures described in this scheme will be put into effect on receipt of “Flood Warning” which may vary in its intensity in respect of the two rivers. In the case of high flood, the entire machinery of the District Government will go into operation.

#### **A: DEFINITIONS.**

**Low Flood** means an indifferent overflow of water over low lying areas along the river banks which is not likely to do any damage.

**Medium Flood** means a rise in water level which would irrigate higher tracts but would not cause any damage to the embankment.

**High Flood** means an abnormal rise in the river which would cause damage to low lying areas known as Hithar. It is probably here that the

water might cross over the embankment, destroy the canal banks and cause damage to the adjoining villages/localities.

**NOTE:**

The terminology of different kinds of floods as given above is low, medium and high and they will be taken as such in the light of any wireless message received from the respective warning centers.

Emergency Officer means the Officer In-charge of the Emergency Office at the District Headquarter. He will work under the direct control of the Deputy Commissioner. **The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Sargodha will act as an Emergency Officer at District Headquarters.** The Emergency Office shall have the following telephone number available on a twenty-four hours basis: 9230255 and FAX No.9230867.

Sector Officer means an Officer In-charge of a sector. He will normally be of the rank of Assistant Commissioner. He will control and supervise the work of all Sub-Sector Officers within his area of jurisdiction. Sectors means a block of two to four sub-sectors situated in a Tehsil. Sub-Sector Officer means the Officer In-charge of a sub-sector who shall be assisted by the Kanungos, Patwaris and other officers and officials of other departments in the area or sector concerned.

**C: DISTRICT FLOOD RELIEF COMMITTEE**

A District Flood Relief Committee consisting of the official members has been constituted vide Appendix-I which would be required to study all the flood problems and work out ways and means to resolve them. The Committee will meet during the emergency as and when required by the District Coordination Officer, Sargodha who will be its Chairman.

**D: FLOOD WARNINGS.**

The Executive Engineer Irrigation and all their Sub-Divisional Officers and officers in-charge of the various Head Works over the two rivers shall send a wireless message as well as postal telegram about the discharge in rivers to the Deputy Commissioner, District Police Officer, Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) and the Assistant Commissioners about low, medium and high flood. All flood telegrams received either through the government or the Canal Telegraph Office should immediately be brought to the notice of the Deputy Commissioner, Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) and the Assistant Commissioners (Revenue), Sahiwal, Bhera, Kot Momin and Shahpur. Effective arrangements are required for prompt transmission of flood warnings to the concerned Sector Officers and the general public i.e. wireless, phone, fax & e-mail, internet etc.

On receipt of flood warning from Mangla, Rasul, Marala, Khanki and Qaidrabad Headworks or the Relief Commissioner, the Deputy Commissioner, Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) and Assistant Commissioners will take prompt action to disseminate information about flood to all concerned. All flood warnings and messages received through wireless or telephones, fax, e-mail, internet etc by the officials should immediately be

entered in a register to be kept in the Control Centers for keeping notes and record of important events. Similarly, such messages and warnings shall, on receipt, be entered in the roznamcha by each S.H.O. concerned.

No warning will be issued for low flood but medium or high flood warnings will on receipt be immediately repeated by express telegrams, telephone or wireless messages to the followings:

A high flood warning may also vary in its intensity. A dangerously high flood will be communicated as "Red High Flood" and the entire administrative machinery shall go into full action on such a signal.

On receipt of flood warning, it will be the responsibility of all the revenue and police officials, the Sector/Sub-sector Officers and other officers and staff of other departments to disseminate information about flood in all villages in their jurisdiction by the quickest possible means of communication. Horse and motorcycle riders and special messengers should be used wherever the means of communication permit. To sum up, the officer in-charge of flood operations within the area of his jurisdiction shall be responsible to carry out the following duties:

- a: to give wide publicity of the impending flood to every village in his area and to satisfy himself that the inhabitants of every village are warned by beat of drum against the imminent danger. Every officer should acquaint himself about the various problems and means of communication in his sector beforehand so that he is well informed at the time of emergency;
- b: to evacuate the inhabitants from the dangerous zones by boats, rafts or any other available source;
- c: to afford relief and alleviate distress of the people of flooded villages by providing food, clothing, temporary shelter and fodder for animals;
- d: to keep the Deputy Commissioner informed by telegram, telephone, wireless or any other quickest possible means of any important change in the flood situation;
- e: to watch the progress of the flood, the damages it has caused and to keep a daily diary.

- f. An initial assessment should be made to identify the number and demographics of the affected population in order to estimate the quantity and type of food required. Initially the victims cannot cook food for themselves therefore the normal routine is that cooked food is provided for the first few days. This cooked food normally includes rice with other additions from time to time, But generally rice being easy to cook and distribute is the first choice of cooked food. The management of Relief Camp will set up distribution points within the relief camps and then ensuring that all affected people get proper food.
- g. Camp managements should register the number of affected people in each camp. Secondly they should set up food distributions points and also ensure provision of clean drinking water as per some time period. Local diets may vary from place to place and that should always be kept in mind. Wastage, pilferage, should be avoided through effective camp management.

Every officer will receive a copy of the flood scheme and will move immediately to the place of his duty as soon as he receives the high flood telegrams as mentioned above.

**E: FLOOD CONTROL OFFICE ADDITIONAL DEPUTY COMMISSIONER (REVENUE), SARGODHA.**

A Flood Control Office shall be established in the office of the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Sargodha with the telephone number 9230255 & 9230867 (FAX) which will function round-the-clock during

emergency. The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) will work as Emergency Officer and will be assisted by the (1) Colony Assistant, Sargodha who will act as Incharge of the Flood Control Room (Telephone No. 9230256) (2) the District Officer, Civil Defense, Sargodha and his staff. A roster for 24 hours duty will be maintained in the said office under the supervision of the Emergency Officer who will be responsible for its efficient working. The Emergency Office will work in 2 or 3 shifts and will consist of a staff to handle all possible office and field duties. At least five bicycles will be made available for the use of Naib Qasids at the Flood Control Office with at least two motor-cycles. The District Nazir shall also be put on duty and will be responsible for the proper maintenance of all accounts/expenditure in respect of the flood.

At the Tehsil level, Tehsil Control Room shall be set up which will work round the clock during emergency under the control of respective Assistant Commissioners. The telephone numbers of the Tehsil Control Rooms at Sargodha, Sillanwali, Bhalwal, Bhera. Shahpur, Sahiwal and Kot Momin will be 9230261, 0486-532017, 048-9233024, 04866-90806 (ARC) 0486-310410, 0486786578 and 04866-82510 respectively.

**F: FLOOD RELIEF SECTORS.**

The District has been divided into various sectors for the purpose of dissemination of flood warnings and relief operations (Appendix II).

Necessary changes will be made in the list of sectors according to the requirements of flood and the Sector Officers will be immediately alerted. They will be assisted by the S.H.O. concerned and all officers of

various government departments posted in the sector concerned. Assistant Commissioners will ensure that there is complete co-operation and co-ordination among various departments with a view to ensure effective results.

The Sector Officers would be given a list of all the villages and abadies in their concerned sector with approximate population thereof. A list of vulnerable villages should also be maintained by them so that evacuation may be arranged, if necessary. For this purpose, suitable safe places of evacuation should be selected beforehand and the villagers should also be informed accordingly.

The Sector Officer will be in-charge of all activities and relief work in his sector. Some of his duties have already been mentioned in the preceding paragraphs and the rest can be summarized as under:

1. Dissemination of information about flood;
2. Evacuation and setting up relief camps;
3. Establishment of complaint cell.
4. Scattered camps should be catered for and encouraged to join the main camp.
5. Sector control is an essential part of the camp management and steps should be taken to remove rats, snakes and mosquitoes etc.
6. Un-accompanied and missing children shall be placed separately with proper care and fulfillment of their physical and psycho-social needs. Needs of women as per local and cultural environment shall be considered for establishing separate relief camps for ladies with provision of proper security and light arrangements.
7. As soon as the flood water starts receding, the Sector Officer will be responsible to collect information regarding loss of life, area affected in each village, cropped area affected in each

village, houses damaged or destroyed and livestock killed or missing. The decision of extending gratuitous relief will be determined by the severity and the extent of the calamity and the funds available;

8. He will be responsible for other relief measures in his sector and will also supervise the repair of damaged distributaries and channels on voluntary basis in consultation with the representatives of the canal authorities;
9. He will supervise the work of his associates of other departments and will ensure supply of medical aid to flood affectees and also ensured that veterinarian assistance is readily available. He would particularly ensured that sufficient amount of quinine is distributed to prevent an outbreak of malaria;
10. He will draw out a list of affectees who stand in need of taccavi loans or other loans during the course of the survey of damage caused to the crops, houses, livestock and tubewells/wells in the flood affected areas immediately after flood water recedes. Such list should be sent to the Tehsildar concerned for further action;
11. He will prepare a list of people rendered destitute by the flood for distribution of any free aid required in the form of blankets, free fodder or assistance for reconstruction or repair of houses. These lists should be prepared within a week after the flood water recedes and sent to the Emergency Office. A copy should also be sent to Tehsil Office;

12. He will maintain a daily diary indicating the work done and villages visited by him on each day. The tour programme should be arranged by him keeping in view the possibility of visit of all the affected villages of his sector as frequently as possible. A copy of the diary will be sent to the Saddar Office weekly;
13. Each Sector Office shall maintain a register in which all orders and instructions from the District Headquarter will be pasted as and when received and all reports, messages will be copied.

Visiting Officers shall record their inspection notes in this register which will be placed before them on their visits.

**NOTE:** The direction for the maintenance of a daily diary will equally apply to the officials of other departments working in each sector. They are also required to send a copy of such diary weekly to their District Headquarter and a copy thereof to the Emergency Officer.

**H: REQUISITION OF BOATS.**

An order will be served upon on all ferry contractors on the 1st June to the effect that boats will be required for evacuation purpose, if and when necessary. The Superintendent/Head Clerk shall have the form of requisition order approved and placed on file. This will be issued at once on receipt of a high flood warning from A.I.G. Telecommunications, Lahore. The experience of 1992 & 1997 has shown that such boats were not be readily

available or may have either been removed by the public for their own use or had been washed away. Therefore, the only source of supply of boats in a flood situation might only be the government or the military authorities.

**I: PROVISION OF BOATS AND VOLUNTEER ROWERS.**

The boats allocated by the government will be distributed at strategic points throughout the worst flood affected areas like Miani, Bhera, Chak Mubarik, Aqil Shah, Kandan, Wajidi, Sahiwal etc. The Assistant Commissioners will issue necessary instructions to the Tehsildars and other officers concerned for the maintenance of boats and their use at the time of flood emergencies.

The officers concerned will ensure that boats are used for relief work in flood emergencies. It should be ensured by the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) Assistant Commissioners that boats are in good condition and carry all necessary equipment. They should be carefully checked well in advance of the flood season by the Assistant Commissioners/Tehsildars so that necessary repair work can be done beforehand.

A list of trained boatmen to row the boats will be maintained by the respective Tehsildars. Boatmen engaged for the rowing of boats at the time of flood will be paid their wages out of the Flood Relief Fund.

**J: REQUISITION OF VEHICLES FOR TRANSPORTATION.**

The number of trucks/pick-ups/jeeps required shall be requisitioned through the Secretary, DRTA/DPO for flood duty as and when high flood warning is received from the A.I.G. Telecommunication, Lahore.

These vehicles shall be placed under the charge of Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) or any other officer nominated by the Deputy Commissioner. Jeeps will also be requisitioned from all government departments except those which are required by government agencies for flood relief or infrastructure restoration duties.

**K: MEDICAL AID AND PREVENTIVE MEASURES AGAINST CATTLE DISEASES.**

The Chief Executive Officer (Health) will arrange to send medical aid at the appropriate Relief Centers. Temporary hospitals if necessary will be established at suitable places. It is necessary that all the dispensaries in flood affected areas should have adequate stocks of anti-malaria drugs and antibiotics. The Additional Director Livestock should ensure that adequate stocks are available well before the flood emergency, if stocks are not available at these dispensaries.

The Additional Director Livestock should inform the Deputy Commissioner about the quantity required well in time so that the Deputy Director (Agricultural) can be approached for the purpose.

The Deputy Director (Agriculture) and Additional Director Livestock and Dairy Development should ensure that adequate stocks of vaccine and serum for cattle diseases in the wake of flood are available in hospitals situated in the areas likely to be affected by floods. A report should be sent to the Deputy Commissioner that adequate stocks are available. If stocks are not available, he should intimate the requirements to the Deputy Commissioner so that matter may be pursued at personal level with the Deputy Director (Agricultural)

**L: STOCKS OF WHEAT FOR FLOOD EMERGENCY.**

The District Food Controller Sargodha should ensure that stocks of wheat are available in all the P.R. Centers. He may, if necessary, send proposal to the Deputy Commissioner for opening new P.R. Centers in close vicinity of flood affected areas. The proposed places must be high and immune from flood. In the event of flood, the District Food Controller will ensure that there is no scarcity of food-grains in the affected areas. If there is shortage, he will made immediate arrangements. He will also ensure that adequate wheat is supplied to the flour mills for production of atta for distribution amongst the flood effectees.

**M: STOCK OF WHEAT SEED.**

The Deputy Director (Agri) Sargodha will ensure that sufficient stock of pure wheat seed is available so that there may be no difficulty for the transportation of stocks if roads are damaged and rails are cut off due to heavy floods.

After the flood water recedes it will be necessary to make immediate arrangements for the provision of seed. Tehsildars concerned will give approximate figures of the seed required in their respective tehsil. The Agriculture Department and Pakistan Agriculture Storage and Supply Corporation will make arrangements to open special depots for providing wheat seed at suitable places so that the sowing of rabi crop may not be delayed.

The Agriculture Development Bank of Pakistan will arrange extensive credit facilities for flood effected persons in consultation with the Assistant Commissioners /Tehsildars.

**N: FODDER FOR CATTLE.**

The Additional Director Livestock & Dairy Development Department Sargodha and District Director (Agriculture), Sargodha shall ensure stocks of husk available through normal channels at normal rates in the event of acute scarcity of fodder. However, immediate arrangements should be made for the import of husk from other places for flood-stricken areas.

**O: CENTRAL STORE FOR DIETS.**

In the event of flood calamity, concerned organizations and individuals should send articles and clothes for distribution among flood-stricken people. A central store will be opened in the office of Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) under the charge of Assistant Commissioner, Sargodha. Further more distribution of relief articles will be made according to orders of the Deputy Commissioner. Relief articles will be sent to the deserving flood affectees.

**P: DISTRIBUTION OF TACCAVI LOANS.**

As soon as the flood water recedes, relief work in the form of distribution of amenities, taccavi loans and gratuitous relief etc. will be started. The distribution will be arranged by the Sector Officer. Each Sector Officer will prepare a detailed account of the work done by him and make suggestions regarding the arrangements which should be made to fight the floods next time.

The distribution of flood relief amenities will be supervised by gazetted officers who will be appointed by the Deputy Commissioner. In consultation with the Tehsildar concerned. The Assistant Commissioner will

immediately prepare the approximate requirements of taccavi for seed, construction and repair of houses, purchase of fodder. A case for the grant of taccavi loans should promptly be prepared for submission to the Deputy Commissioner so that there may not be any delay in providing relief to flood victims.

**Q: REMISSION OF LAND REVENUE.**

The matter of remission of land revenue will be taken up after the survey of the flood affected areas by the revenue and irrigation authorities. The officers concerned should, therefore, be very quick in action with regard to assessment of kharaba and remission of land revenue.

**R: REPAIRS OF BREACHES IN CHANNELS.**

Immediately after the flood water recedes, the Deputy Commissioner will hold a joint meeting of the revenue, police and irrigation officers in order to chalk out a programme for repairing the breaches which could not be got repaired on the spot, through voluntary labour which should be procured by the local police and the revenue staff. Deputy Commissioner should make frequent tours of the areas where repair work may be in progress with a view to satisfy themselves that every possible effort is being made to get the breaches filled to avoid any delay in the sowing of rabi crops.

**REMOVAL OF ENCROACHMENT ON RIVER BANKS.**

The Assistant Commissioner, Bhera, Kot Momin, Shahpur & Sahiwal will ensure to remove all the encroachments on the river banks within their area of jurisdiction. They will submit a certificate to the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Sargodha that all the encroachments have been removed on 31.05.2018.

**DUTIES OF THE ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER**

1. All the Assistant Commissioners in their respective area of jurisdiction would be over all incharge of the arrangements to be made during the pre-flood, and post-flood phases.
2. They shall closely supervise the working of their sector officers and maintain a close liaison with the District Control Room and other important agencies at the Sub-Divisional level.
3. They shall keep the District Control Room informed of all the important developments and shall ensure that the directions received from the District Control Room are carried out in letter and spirit.
4. They shall also ensure that the police are deputed at places where the unauthorized cuts are expected from the local population.
5. The relief measures along with the assessment of any damage would be conducted under their close supervision.
6. They shall take necessary steps with the help of local police and Irrigation Department for the protection of flood safety bunds in their respective areas.
7. They shall keep active flood relief teams to cater for the needs for flood affectees in the Relief Camps.
8. They shall ensure evacuation of affected people from the area under emergency.
9. They shall ensure presence of Representatives of all Nation Building Departments as and when required.

10. They shall establish Tehsil Control Room in their offices which will work round the clock.
