SUBJECT: RAIN WINDSTORM/THUNDERSHOWERS PREDICTED IN PROVINCE DURING WEEKEND

Met office (vide Letter No. NWFC-5(10A)/2026/03) informed that moist currents from the Arabian Sea are continuously penetrating the upper parts of the country and likely to strengthen on Saturday (Evening). Meanwhile, a westerly wave is also likely to approach upper parts on Saturday. Under the influence of this weather system:

- **Scattered rain windstorm/thundershower (with isolated heavyfalls)** is expected in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Faisalabad, Khushab, Sargodha, Lahore, Sheikhupura, Sialkot, Narowal, Sahiwal, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Nankana Sahib, Chiniot, Okara, on **11th and 12th**, while in Noor Pur Thal, Bhakkar, Mianwali, Layyah, Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar, D.G. Khan, Multan, Khanewal, Lodhran, Muzaffargarh, Kot Addu, Rahim Yar Khan and Rajanpur on **11th (evening/night) & 12th July** with occasional gaps.

2. Possible Impacts:

- Windstorm & lightning may damage weak structures (solar panels, electric poles, bill boards etc.) during the forecast period.
- Water flow may increase in the hill torrents of DG Khan and nullahs originated from Kashmir on 11th & 12th July.
- Heavy rains may cause localized Urban flooding in Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Lahore and Faisalabad on 11th & 12th July.
- Tourists and travelers are advised to remain extra cautious and avoid unnecessary travelling during the forecast period.
- Farmers are advised to manage their crop activities keeping in view the weather conditions and take care of their livestock as well.
- Prevailing hot and humid conditions are likely to subside during the forecast period.

3. In order to maintain high level of preparedness and mitigation of the disaster all the District administrations and line departments are requested to ensure the following measures:

- i. Ensure **sufficient staffing round-the-clock in DEOCs** for effective coordination and response.
- ii. **Coordinate** with PDMA and all relevant departments to ensure **a unified prompt response**.
- iii. Ensure accurate and timely dissemination of **information on safety measures and evacuation plans** through **electronic and social media**.
- iv. Ensure **effective contingency planning** and preparedness measures for **urban flooding** in Monsoon season 2026.
- v. Ensure timely **desilting and clearance of all the drains** and **pre-placement of heavy earth moving machinery** at choke points to facilitate rapid response.
- vi. Motorway Police shall ensure regular traffic advisories, timely updates on road conditions, and guidance to travelers for safe travel.
- vii. Deploy **additional staff** and resources to high-risk areas.
- viii. Stay **alert Rescue 1122** and ensure pre-position search and rescue teams (DRF) along with necessary equipment
- ix. Generate **Situation Reports (SITREPS)** to cover any major incidents/developments on regular basis.
- x. Ensure **data collection and reporting** for post-flood analysis and improvements.
