SUBJECT: MORE MONSOON RAINS PREDICTED IN THE COUNTRY FROM 29TH JULY TO 5TH AUGUST

Met office (**vide Letter No. NWFC-5(10A)/2026/06**) informed that monsoon currents from Arabian Sea & Bay of Bengal are likely to penetrate upper and central parts of the country from **29th July**. A westerly wave is currently affecting northern areas, which is likely to strengthen and affect most upper and central parts from **1st August**. Under the influence of this weather system:

- **Rain-wind/thundershowers (with scattered heavy falls at times very heavy)** is expected in Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Okara, Kasur, Sheikhpura, Nankana Sahib, Faisalabad, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Chiniot, Khushab, Mianwali, Layyah, Bhakkar, Noorpurthal, Sargodha, Sahiwal and Pakpattan from **29th July to 4th August** with occasional gaps..
- **Rain-wind/thundershowers (with scattered heavy falls)** is expected in Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar, Rahim Yar Khan, Khanpur, Multan, Vehari, Khanewal, Lodhran, Muzaffargarh, Kot Addu, Dera Ghazi Khan and Rajanpur from **31st July to 3rd August** with occasional gaps.

2. Possible Impacts:

- Heavy rains may cause Urban flooding in low lying areas of Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Sialkot, Lahore, Multan and Faisalabad from **30th July to 4th August**.
- Landslides may occur in vulnerable areas of Murree, Galliat from **30th July to 5th August**.
- Heavy rains may generate flash floods in local streams/Nullahs of Kashmir, Murree, Galliat, Northeastern Punjab, hill torrents of DG Khan during the forecast period.
- Heavy rains, Windstorm & lightning may damage weak structures (solar panels, electric poles, bill boards etc.) during the forecast period.
- Tourists and travelers are advised to remain cautious during the forecast period.
- Farmers are advised to manage their crop activities keeping in view the weather conditions and take care of their livestock as well.

3. In order to maintain high level of preparedness and mitigation of the disaster all the District administrations and line departments are requested to ensure the following measures:

- i. Ensure **sufficient staffing round-the-clock in DEOCs** for effective coordination and response.
- ii. **Coordinate** with PDMA and all relevant departments to ensure **a unified prompt response**.
- iii. Ensure accurate and timely dissemination of **information on safety measures and evacuation plans** through **electronic and social media**.
- iv. Ensure **effective contingency planning** and preparedness measures for **flooding** in Monsoon season 2026.
- v. Ensure timely **desilting and clearance of all the drains** and **pre-placement of heavy earth moving machinery** at choke points to facilitate rapid response.
- vi. Motorway Police shall ensure regular traffic advisories, timely updates on road conditions, and guidance to travelers for safe travel.
- vii. Deploy **additional staff** and resources to high-risk areas.
- viii. Stay **alert Rescue 1122** and ensure pre-position search and rescue teams (DRF) along with necessary equipment
- ix. Generate **Situation Reports (SITREPS)** to cover any major incidents/developments on regular basis.
- x. Ensure **data collection and reporting** for post-flood analysis and improvements.
